HARRIS: REQUEST FOR INQUIRY - FALSIFICATION OF HYDROTEST

On November 8, 1982, Wells Eddleman of Durham, NC regarding a letter he had written to the NRC, Commission Secretary, Samuel J. Child, date stamped September 28, 1982, wherein Mr. Eddleman stated that he was told "the testing piping on some of the stainless steel vessels was welded shut inside the pipe so that pressure tests would seem okay even though the vessels and piping involved would actually leak". This activity allegedly had taken place at the Duke Power Company's (DPC) Shearon Harris plant near Durham, NC.

During the telephone conversation, er. Eddleman said that he did not know the individual's name who provided the information to him and, if he did, he would not disclose it to the NRC. He stated that all the NRC needs to know is that the pipes mentioned are faulty and should be inspected. [Mr. Eddleman] did not have anything else to say regarding the concerns mentioned in his letter.

On November 10, 1982, Carl Alderson, Director, Enforcement Staff, and RII:01 interface was advised of the foregoing and that OI:RII did not plan any further investigative action on this matter.
