

We truly appreciate your involvement in our concerns over the building of the Midland Nuclear Plants by Consumer Power Company.

We have a request. Would you contact the Nuclear Regulatory Commission and determine the progress of the selection of an independent auditor (auditors) for the Midland project and dates at which public meetings will again be held.

Given the past record of quality control and quality assurance problems, we believe it is crucial that a reputable and respected independent auditing firm (firms) be determined as soon as possible.

In addition, the first public meeting held by the NRC attracted about 400 people and many were unable to hear or see because of the congestion. It seems imperative that the public be given further opportunity to question and comment before the NRC.
