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It seems like you told me earlier that during this conversation, you think McCoy kind of broke away and called Ken Brockman?

Yeah. Yeah. I remember -- I remember hearing something in the background about that, and that's all I remember. It was not, you know, primary in the conversation. It was something I kind of heard in the background. Also during that conversation, Harriston came in, and I'm not sure exactly when, but he said something about, "So, there weren't any failures." Okay. And I heard McCoy say something to him and, again, in the background. I didn't catch, you know, on the phone what was being said. They weren't --

But still, even after the comprehensive test program, there were 18 successful starts in a row?

Yeah. I'm going through. So, at that point, you know, the concern was raised on the phone. The failures were stated to Shipman, and they were stated to Stringfellow. Stringfellow realized that it meant the other information was false and then again stated in -the concerns raised in this big conversation with the higher level executives, and then Bochhold, you know, assuring everybody that the data is good, and at that point, it's essentially sold, and, you know, that was on the 18th, and I guess that was -- it was the next day that
