The National Bureau of Standards Reactor (NBSR) is located on the grounds of the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) in Gaithersburg, Maryland. As reported previously, on August 22, 1995 at approximately 7:10 am, two voice mail messages were received on the office phone of the NIST Chief of Facility Services. The phone messages were garbled and unintelligible, but enhancement by in-house staff revealed the words "bomb", "in Nuclear Reactor building", "6 million", "Hurry up" and multiple uses of "Now". The voice appeared to be male. The reactor was not operating at the time and had been shut down for the last fourteen months. NIST declared an Unusual Event, notified the FBI, and heightened security awareness. The NRC Information Assessment Team (IAT) was informed of this event.

On August 24, 1995 at approximately 7:30 am a third voice mail message was received on the office phone of the NIST Chief of Facility Services. The phone message was again garbled and unintelligible. The message was sent to in-house staff for enhancement. At 8:45 am the Reactor Director was notified that another garbled message had been received. Again, the reactor was not operating. As a precaution the facility was searched, including the roof and outside grounds. No explosive device or other unusual item was found. No references to the reactor facility were noted, so an Unusual Event declaration was not made. NIST Security notified the FBI. NIST Security does not believe the threat to be credible. The NRC Information Assessment Team (IAT) was
