Dear Mr. Powell:

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. § 552, and the regulations of the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission ("NRC") promulgated thereunder (10 C.F.R. Part 9, Subpart A), I hereby request copies of the following records:

1. All documents that discuss, contain, describe, indicate, or otherwise reference information related to NRC or NRC contractor efforts addressing the regulatory or technical acceptability of the 1983 revision to IEEE 323, "IEEE Standard for Qualifying Class 1E Equipment for Nuclear Power Generating Stations."
2. All documents that discuss, describe, indicate, or otherwise reference the use of IEEE 323-1983 as a standard for qualification of electrical equipment for Advance Light Water Reactor designs.
3. All documents that discuss, contain, describe, indicate, or otherwise reference an evaluation of IEEE 323-1983, or comparison of IEEE 323-1983 and IEEE

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323-1974, regarding their application to qualification of electrical equipment at operating or future reactors.

4. All documents that discuss, contain, describe, indicate, or otherwise reference an evaluation of IEEE 323-1983, or comparison of IEEE 323-1983 and IEEE 323-1974, regarding the IEEE position that the 1983 revision is a clarification of IEEE 323-1974 and does not impose new requirements.
5. All documents that discuss, contain, describe, indicate, or otherwise reference NRC future plans or schedules for evaluating the acceptability of IEEE 323-1983 as a standard for qualification of electrical equipment.

For purposes of this FOIA request, the term "documents" includes, but is not limited to, studies, reports, data, memoranda, letters, telephone logs, notes, meeting agendas, attendances sheets, fact sheets, issue papers, and computer messages (*i.e.*, "E-Mail").

This FOIA request covers all documents in the possession of the NRC, regardless of the location of the documents, including, but not limited to, those located at NRC headquarters and any component thereof or the NRC Regional offices and any component thereof.

If any written documents responsive to his FOIA request exist but are being withheld pursuant to a FOIA exemption from disclosure provision, for each document, describe the document and specifically identify the reason for the withholding, the FOIA exemption authorizing the withholding, and the name and title of the person responsible for the withholding. Such information is specifically required in withholding situations by FOIA and NRC regulations (See 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(A)(i) and (C) and 10 C.F.R. § 9.27) and must be detailed. See, e.g., Mead Data Central, Inc. v. U.S. Dept. of the Air Force, 566 F.2d 242, 250-51 (D.C. Cir. 1977); Senate of Puerto Rico v. U.S. Dept. of Justice, 823 F.2d 574, 585 (D.C. Cir. 1987).

I understand that under 10 C.F.R. § 9.23 the NRC has ten days to respond to this request, and is required to provide "the

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
