

SUBJECT: CLOSEOUT OF NRC GENERIC LETTER NO. 89-08, EROSION/CORROSION INDUCED PIPE WALL THINNING, SEABROOK STATION, UNIT 1, MPA B-108 (TAC NO. M73539)

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that we have reviewed your response to NRC Generic Letter 89-08 and now consider the issue closed.

By your letters number NYN-89095, dated July 24, 1989, and number NYN-91180, dated November 4, 1991, New Hampshire Yankee responded to NRC Generic Letter 89-08 for the Seabrook Station, Unit 1. In NYN-89095, you indicated that you have developed a program for monitoring the effects of erosion/corrosion on pipe wall thickness resulting from single phase flow in carbon steel systems at Seabrook Station based on NUMARC guidelines (Appendix A of NUREG-1344), and that this program includes a reexamination of selected monitoring points every refueling outage. In NYN-91180, you indicated that you have developed a similar program for monitoring the effects of erosion/corrosion on pipe wall thickness resulting from two phase flow in carbon steel systems at Seabrook Station. These erosion/corrosion monitoring programs were implemented by Seabrook Station operating procedures during the first refueling outage. In NYN-91180 you indicated that all implementation is complete.

Based on our review of your submittals, we conclude that the actions taken to date, fully respond to the issues identified in the subject generic letter. Therefore, we consider this issue closed and TAC No. M73539 is closed by this letter. The staff may conduct an inspection of your implementation at a later time.
