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TOPICSRESPONSIBLE INDIVIDUAL

- Consideration must be given to adjacent property owners and state park visitors during scenario development. Scenario Development Committee
- Drill scenario development will focus on: Scenario Development Committee
 1. Civil disturbance.
 2. Bomb threats.
 3. Attempted protected area penetration.
- Each party participating should develop drill objectives and scope by January 7, 1987. Scenario Development Committee
- The next meeting is scheduled for 10 a.m. on January 7, 1987 in Conference Room C at Palisades. Plant Security, ARNG and LLEA personnel will attend. Scenario Development Committee
- Gary Balcom and Brian Rabideau should visit the Point Beach Plant in December. They have conducted 3 similar exercises. We should learn from their experience in developing our scenario. SCCote
- NRC may be invited to participate or observe. SCCote
- ARNG needs LLEA to work with their squads to practice civil disturbance procedures. ARNG asked plant Security to coordinate effort with LLEA. SCCote
- The Michigan State Police will be invited to participate in the drill. SCCote
- Coordination with the CPCo corporate legal staff. BRabideau
- ARNG plans to use a helicopter for recon purposes during the drill. Consideration must be given to restricted airspace over plant. ARNG needs to know radius of restricted airspace. BRabideau
- Coordination should be made with local media. GWBalcom/JRStorey
- ARNG asked about possibility of plant tours. Arrangements will be made to support their request. GWBalcom/JStorey

TOPICSRESPONSIBLE INDIVIDUAL

- There is a need to establish an operations center for plant Security, ARNG and LLEA decision makers. ARNG also asked for use of plant telephone for emergency purposes during drill. The Support Building was tentatively selected as the operations center. GWBalcom
- Special ID cards may need to be prepared and issued to contractor employees working at the plant during the drill to permit access to the plant owner controlled area (main access road). GWBalcom
- Palisades Daily Status announcements need to be developed to inform plant employees of the drill. GWBalcom
- Consideration must be given to plant shift change times and impact on drill scenarios. GWBalcom
- The areas adjacent to the warehouse will be used to billeted the majority of ARNG personnel in tents. GWBalcom
- Dave Andrews should be contacted to coordinate any environmental concerns. GWBalcom
- Availability of ARNG medical staff will be limited during the drill. ANRG asked about local medical support and were told that the plant has an agreement with two local hospitals that will provide assistance during medical emergencies. JRBrunet

- The Berrien and Van Buren County Sheriff Departments have agreed to participate in the drill.
- No excavation will be permitted on-site.
- No alcoholic beverages will be permitted on-site.
- Water and toilet facilities to be provided by ARNG.
- 300 to 400 ARNG personnel will be on-site to participate in the drill.
- ARNG needs to test their civil defense procedures and wants to reserve August 16th for that purpose.

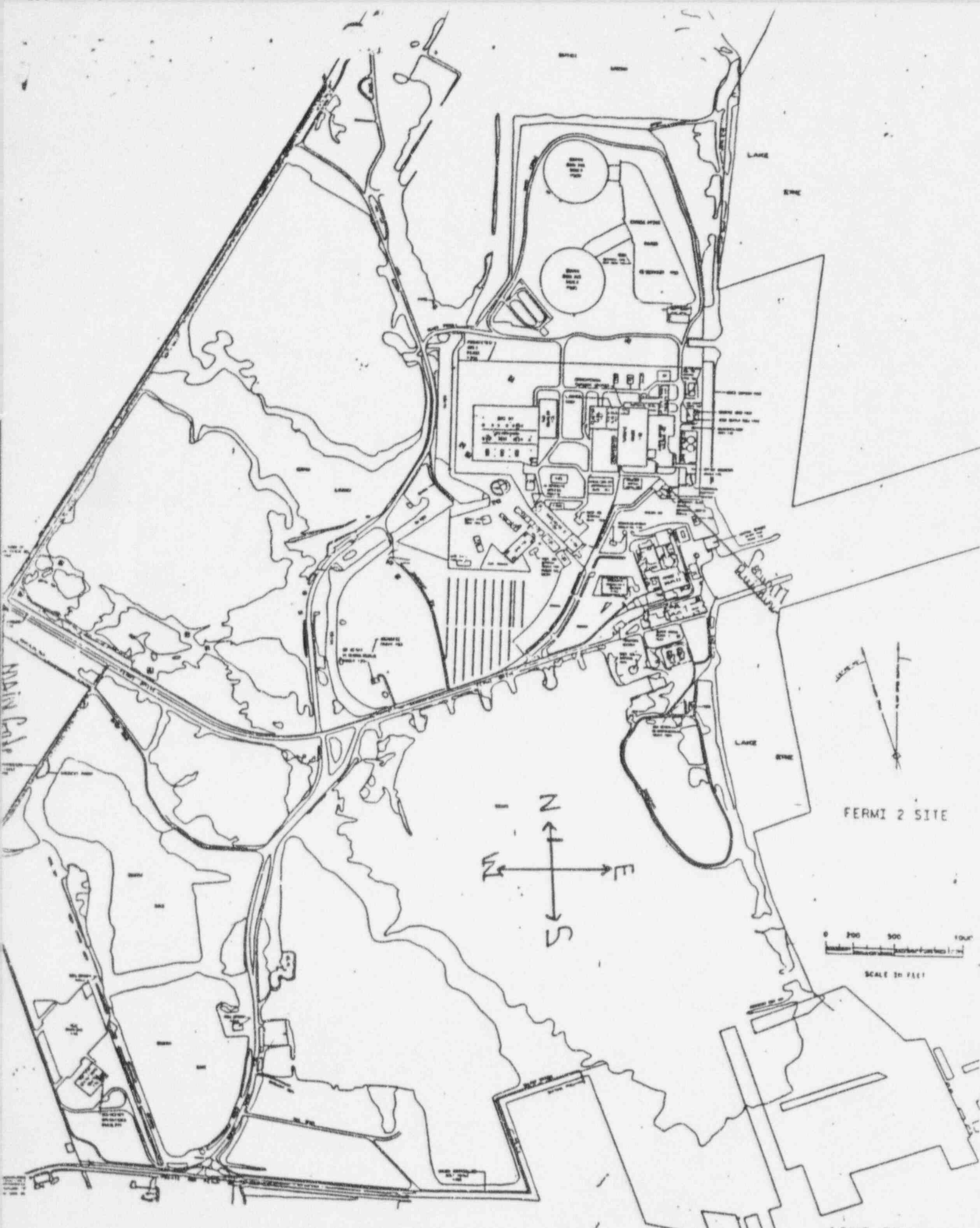

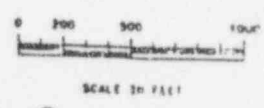

ON 09-21-91 at 16:30 hours officer Brunt was the dedicated observer of zone "91 from the zone three booth. At this time officer Brunt reported to the CAS operator lieutenant Stevens that a army green helicopter was flying towards the plant at a low altitude. The helicopter approached the zone three booth paused then flew over the service building at about 200 feet from the ground, then left heading towards the state park. At 16:35 hours on 09-21-91 Property Protection Supervisor Steven Cate was notified of the incident.

At 16:45 hours on 09-21-91 Lt mikusko called the Federal Aviation Association out of grand rapids who connected Lt mikusko to a Mr Hollis Locke, a watch supervisor out of Kalamazoo. Mr Locke had no information on any military exercises going on in the area. Mr Locke gave his phone number in case we needed any more information. (416) 345-6026. At 1700 hours on 09-21-91 Lt mikusko called the South Haven air port, they reported that a helicopter had landed at the airport around 1655 hours on 09-21-91. The information they had on the helicopter is as follows. It was a green helicopter, it had united states army written on the tail section of the helicopter. The air craft Identification number was # 26148. The make and model of the helicopter was VH 60A.

The number #148 was on the nose of the helicopter. The helicopter had one fuel tank on the side of each wing. There were four individuals in the crew of the helicopter. The only name written on the sign in log was a. Mr W. Mart. Officer Brunt was sent to the South Haven airport to take a look at the helicopter to verify if it was the aircraft she saw, she stated it was. The office messenger stated that after the helicopter landed, the crew left the airport on motorcycles, he did not have a chance to talk to them. Steven Cole was informed of this information.

DETAILS AND CIRCUMSTANCES OF INCIDENT (Answer all of the following in the report: WHO, WHAT, WHERE, WHEN, & HOW.)

At APPROX 1630 pm ON 10-21-91 I Angela BRUNT was in the zone #3 booth observing zones 91 & 89, when I noticed a helicopter comming towards the plant from the STATE PARK AREA. It was extremely low so I notified the CAS operator. The helicopter circled the plant very low and came back on the lake side. At this time it went back towards the STATE PARK turned around came over the discharges, circled and pointed directly in front of my booth at EYE level and stayed there about 60 seconds or so. I was in constant communications WITH the CAS and SAS operators. The helicopter then went back over the plant towards the landing strip down by the stockroom and we lost EYESIGHT OF IT.... IT had no numbers ON IT.... END OF REPORT

NRC INFORMATION NOTICE NO. 87-27: IRANIAN OFFICIAL IMPLIES VAGUE THREAT TO
U.S. RESOURCES

Addressees:

All nuclear power reactor facilities holding an operating license (OL) or a construction permit (CP), research and nonpower reactor facilities, and fuel fabrication and processing facilities using or possessing formula quantities of special nuclear material.

Purpose:

This information notice is provided to notify licensees of information received which could be a vague threat to U.S. nuclear facilities.

Description of Circumstances:

A recent radio broadcast from Tehran reported that an Iranian official indicated, in a public speech, that U.S. centers, nuclear reactors and other U.S. interests worldwide can be more vulnerable to attack than Iranian missile bases in Iran.

Discussion:

The NRC is monitoring the situation and is in contact with other government agencies as to the significance of this information. Based on the information currently available, NRC concludes that licensee action in response to this information is not warranted at this time. If additional information is received which changes this position, notification will be made. If you have any questions, please contact the technical contact listed below.
