SUBJECT: SUPPLEMENT TO SAFETY EVALUATION DATED MAY 6, 1991 REGARDING THE BEAVER VALLEY UNIT 1 SECOND-INTERVAL INSERVICE TESTING PROGRAM FOR PUMPS AND VALVES (TAC M80479/M61257)

By letter dated March 21, 1988, Duquesne Light Company (DLC) submitted the Inservice Testing (IST) program for pumps and valves for the second ten-year interval starting from September 20, 1987, for the Beaver Valley Power Station, Unit 1. In a letter dated May 6, 1991, the NRC : aff provided DLC the Safety Evaluation for the IST program (reviewed under TAC M61257). In this Safety Evaluation, Relief Requests 18 and 20 were granted, provided the applicable check valves are full-stroke exercised open in accordance with Generic Letter (GL) 89-04, Attachment 1, Position 1. Subsequently, DLC requested the NRC to evaluate previously submitted information related to test methods which were not in accordance with GL 89-04, Position 1. The test methods were described in DLC submittals dated March 21, 1988 / pril 27 1989. Additional information was made available to the NRC on ay 31, 1991, including previous test results, test procedures, and computer program descriptions (this material was placed on the docket by memorandum dated December 27, 1991). We have completed our review of the alternative testing methods and the results are documented in the enclosed Safety Evaluation. We were provided technical assistance with this evaluation by Oak Ridge National Laboratory (ORNL). We adopt the evaluations and conclusions contained in the Technical Evaluation Report prepared by ORNL.

Relief granted in the May E, 1991 Safety Evaluation remains valid, provided the licensee meets GL 89-04, Position 1. Alternatively, if DLC meets GL 89-04, Position 2, relief is approved per GL 89-04. The staff has determined that the relief, as previously granted, pursuant to 10 CFR 50.55a(a)(6)(i) with provisions, is authorized by law and will not endanger life or property, or the common defense and security, and is otherwise in the public interest.

DLC is requested to address the issues discussed in the Safety Evaluation and submit revisions to the IST program relief requests if appropriate. The actions to resolve the concerns should be submitted within 1 year of the date of the Safety Evaluation or by the next refueling outage, whichever is

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later. The requirements of this letter affect fewer than 10 respondents, and therefore, are not subject to Office of Management and Budget review under P.L. 96-511.
