This is in response to J. P. O'Reilly's March 8, 1984 letter to H. G. Parris transmitting a Notice of Violation (IE Inspection Report Nos. (50-259/83-51, -260/83-51, -296/83-51) and March 7, 1984 letter transmitting the Proposed Imposition of Civil Penalty related to Browns Ferry Nuclear Plant physical security. Enclosure 1 provides our response to the subject violation and enclosure 2 describes management actions to increase the overall effectiveness of the Browns Ferry security program.
