INTERVENOR'S OBJECTIONS TO JUNE 6, 1984 NOTICE OF EVIDENTIARY HEARING

On June 6, 1984 this Licensing Board issued a Notice of Evidentiary Hearing specifying that the portion of the Contention XX evidentiary hearing which commences in Los Angeles on June 25, 1984 will not be open to the public. CBG hereby objects to the blanket exclusion of the public from these hearings.

As a general rule, evidentiary hearings before NRC Licensing Boards on licensing matters are open to the public. The primary exception to this rule is when those hearings involve protected information. When such protected information is involved, the exclusion of the public from the hearing should be strictly limited to those portions of the hearing which include or directly involve protected information.

In this case, Intervenor will present at least five witnesses, Messrs. Taylor, Hafmeister, Ramberg, Hirsch and Rogge, who have not had access to protected information and whose testimony will not involve or directly deal with protected matters. In the same manner as the Board has indicated that the testimony of Drs. Taylor and Hafmeister will be taken in a public session, so should the testimony of Messrs. Ramberg, Hirsch and Rogge. Furthermore, any rebuttal testimony to these witnesses to the maximum extent possible should not be taken in camera nor under the protective order.

Closing the hearings to the public in their entirety not only violates public policy, but it will also severely prejudice CBG's ability to present its case and respond to the case of the staff and applicant. If the Board is over-inclusive in taking testimony in camera, it will have the effect of making it impossible for Intervenor to consult with its non-protected experts and to avail itself of non-protected interrogators.

Therefore, for the reasons stated above, CBG hereby requests that the Board revise its Notice of Evidentiary Hearing to reflect that only those portions of the hearing which involve protected information or which deal directly with protected matters will not be open to the public.
