SUBJECT: PHYSICAL SECURITY LICENSE CONDITION AMENDMENT AND EXEMPTION,
SHOREHAM NUCLEAR POWER STATION, UNIT 1 (TAC NO. MB0950)

The Commission has issued the enclosed Amendment No. 8 to Facility Operating License No. NPF-82 for the Shoreham Nuclear Power Station, Unit 1 (SNPS) in response to your application of October 9, 1990, and as supplemented by your letters of November 4 and 8, 1991. The supplemental letters did not change the original intent of the application request and did not affect the staff's original no significant hazards determination.

The amendment revises Paragraph 2.E of the SNPS license. When coupled with the enclosed exemption from the requirements of 10 CFR Part 73, and proposed changes to the SNPS Physical Security Plan, this amendment will allow the reduction of certain physical security requirements including vital areas and equipment, systems and procedures, and the required number of armed responders. These physical security requirement reductions were determined to be acceptable for a nuclear facility that is in a shutdown and permanently defueled condition such as SNPS.

A Notice of Consideration of Issuance of Amendment to Facility Operating License and Opportunity for Hearing related to the requested action was published in the FEDERAL REGISTER on October 2, 1991, (56 FR 49923). No comments or requests for a hearing were received. Enclosed is a copy of an Environmental Assessment and Finding of No Significant Hazards, which was published in the FEDERAL REGISTER.

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A copy of our Safety Evaluation and Exemption are also enclosed. Also enclosed is a copy of the Notice of Issuance of Facility Operating License and Final Determination of No Significant Hazards Consideration that will be forwarded to the Office of the Federal Register for publication. A repeat Notice of Issuance will be included in the Commission's next regular biweekly FEDERAL REGISTER notice. This amendment and exemption are effective as of the date of issuance.

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
