Dear Mr. Kraft:

From June 3 through July 22, 1995, C. Miller and others of this office, and R. Ganser of the Illinois Department of Nuclear Safety conducted an inspection of your facility. This inspection included a review of authorized activities for your Quad Cities Nuclear Power Station facility. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with those members of your staff identified in the enclosed report.

The areas examined during the inspection are identified in the report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of a selective examination of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observation of activities in progress.

During this inspection, certain of your activities appeared to be in violation of NRC requirements, as specified in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice). We are concerned that previously identified problems in the fire protection program have not received adequate attention; including poor fire brigade training, numerous fire impairments, and recurring problems with emergency lighting. Self assessment and corrective action in this area were weak. In addition, maintenance errors and failure to follow procedures led to a damaged control rod drive and increased radiation exposure and poor evaluation of maintenance effects on systems.

You are required to respond to this letter and should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice when preparing your response. In your response, you should document the specific actions taken and any additional actions you plan to prevent recurrence. After reviewing your response to this Notice, including your proposed corrective actions and the results of future inspections, the NRC will determine whether further NRC enforcement action is necessary to ensure compliance with NRC regulatory requirements.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.790 of the Commission's regulations, a copy of this letter, the enclosures, and your response to this letter will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room. The responses directed by this letter and the accompanying Notice are not subject to the clearance procedures of the Office of Management and Budget as required by the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980, PL 96-511.

We will gladly discuss any questions you have concerning this inspection.
