SUMMARY OF MANAGEMENT ACTIONS

A. Initiative Taken:

In order to meet the increased screening needs and to support both planned or unplanned outages, the Fitness for Duty Department has been relocated into a larger facility thereby increasing producivity and improving the overall image of the Fitness for Duty Department.

B. Lessons Learned:

1. River Bend Station site procedure was revised to enhance the notification process of randomly-selected individuals. The revision allows the supervisor four hours from the time FFD makes notification to him to arrange the donor's work accordingly. Once FFD notifies the supervisor, he has the discretion to delay notification to the selected individual until such time as that individual's work is at a point where the individual may be released to report to FFD for testing. Once the individual has been advised by his supervisor that he has been randomly selected to report to FFD, the individual must immediately report to the FFD facility.

C. Effectiveness Evaluation:

No deficiencies in the program were noted.
