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Commissioner Palladino: Please come to order.

This is an affirmation discussion session. We have planned three items for this afternoon, but I understand we need a vote to hold this meeting unless one week's notice.

I'm going to ask the secretary to identify the items so that we can vote on short notice.

SECRETARY CHILK: Three items. The three items are SECY-84-116, second item is SECY-84-182, and the third item is SECY-84-218.

That vote would hold an affirmation on these in less than one week.

RESPONSE: Aye.

SECY-84-116, it's the JCLA reactor license renewal proceeding and a staff request to initiate rule making on the interpretation of 10 CFR 73.40(a).

In this paper the Commission is being asked to approve a proposed order that declines the NRC staff's request to initiate a rule making to modify two decisions by the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board.

The board decisions held at 10CFR7340 requires

UCLA to take some measure to protect the reactor from

potential sabotage.

The extent of the measures is the issue that was

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before the board. Mr. Roberts, Asselstine and Bernthal have approved the proposed order that was attached to the paper.

Chairman Palladino has disapproved it and has separate views, which have been distributed. Mr. Gilinsky is not participating.

Would you please affirm your vote?

RESPONSE: Aye.

SECRETARY CHILK: The second item is 84-182, <u>sua</u>

<u>sponte</u> issue raised in the matter of Duke Power

Company, where the Commission is being asked to approve a proposed order that terminates consideration by the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board of a contention that was raised <u>sua sponte</u> by the board to consider sitespecific problems experienced with Catawba's diesel generator manufactured by TDI.

Chairman Palladino, Commissioner ets, and
Commissioner Bernthal have approve the proposed order.
Commissioner Gilinsky and Asselstine have disapproved it.

They both have separate views which have been distributed to the Commission. Would you please affirm your vote?

RESPONSE: Aye.

SECRETARY CHILK: The third item is SECY-84-218.

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It's a Shoreham-Suffolk County motion to clarify CLI-84-8.

The Commission in this order is being asked to approve a proposed order that responds to a motion by Suffolk County and support by the State of New York for clarification of the Commission's order of May 16.

The order indicates in part that Suffolk has demonstrated no practical consequences from the Commission's use of the word "resume" to characterize the hearing and the State of New Yark concerned that the hearing would denied procedural rights as speculative.

Commissioners Roberts, Asselstine, and Bernthal have approved the proposed order as it was enclosed in the SECY paper with the modifications drafted by OGC to identify other pertinent and similar motions.

Commissioner Gilinsky is not participating.

Chairman Palladino abstains and I would like to read
his current vote of abstaining.

"I have decided to withdraw my earlier vote and to abstain on this matter. The reasons for my decisions are as follows: on June 6, 1984, Suffolk County in the State of New York filed a request for my recusal. I have not had sufficient time to review in detail the arguments made in that paper, consult with legal

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counsel or consider the steps I should take in responding to it. Therefore, I am not prepared at this time to respond to the request.

My action in this matter does not imply a decision on my part with regard to the requested r or my participation in any future Shoreham matter."

Please affirm your vote.

RESPONSE: Aye.

SECRETARY CHILK: Mr. Chairman, that concludes the affirmation.

Chairman Palladino: Anything further to come before us? Thank you. The meeting is adjourned.
