4. A copy of the transcripts from an interview and/or deposition taken by the NRC of any and all employees or agents of Nuclear Support Services, Inc. ("NSSI") investigated by the NRC Office of Investigations ("OI") regarding discrimination of Mr. Saporito in his attempts to secure employment in the nuclear industry.
