Dear Mr. Kingsley:

On January 14 and 15, 1992, NRC senior managers met to review the performance of nuclear power plants licensed to operate by the NRC. These meetings are conducted semiannually to focus NRC resources on those plants and related issues of greatest safety significance. At this meeting, Browns Ferry was discussed.

At the Commission Meeting in April 1991, Browns Ferry Unit 2 received Commission approval to restart upon completion of all outstanding restart commitments. On May 23, 1991, the Region II Regional Administrator, in consultation with myself and the Director of NRR, determined that TVA had met all outstanding restart commitments and granted permission to restart Unit 2. This action resulted in Browns Ferry Unit 2's shifting from a category of plants requiring Commission approval to restart to a category of plants requiring close monitoring. Plants in this latter category have been identified as having weaknesses that warrant increased NRC attention from both Headquarters and the Regional Office until the licensee demonstrates a period of improved performance.

Browns Ferry Units 1 and 3 will be maintained in the category of plants that requires NRC authorization to operate and receives close monitoring by the NRC. Plants placed in this category are having or have had significant weaknesses that warrant maintaining the plant in a shutdown condition until the licensee can demonstrate to the NRC that adequate programs have been both established and implemented to ensure substantial improvement.

A summary of discussions held relating to Browns Ferry is provided below:

TVA's betterment and corrective action programs continue to contribute to improved performance. Subsequent to criticality of the Unit 2 reactor on May 24, 1991, the Browns Ferry staff completed the power ascension programs in a deliberate and thorough manner with a minimum of problems. The NRC staff monitored the startup, power ascension, and operations and will continue to observe operations to enable an assessment of sustained operational performance

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prior to NRC sensor management's making a decision on change of category for Unit 2. Browns Ferry Units 1 and 3 remain in their present status, which requires NRC authorization to restart.

An NRC Commission meeting, open to the public, has been scheduled for February 5, 1992, to review the results of the latest meeting of NRC managers. Mr. Stewart D. Ebneter, the Region II Administrator, has discussed the basis for our conclusions with regard to the Browns Ferry facility with members of your staff.
