MR. LAZARUS: Today is March 27, 1990, we're at Vogtle Station, 10:56 a.m.

We are interviewing Norma Dewbre, Pauline Jenkins and Teresa Jones.

Whereupon,

# NORMA DEWBRE PAULINE JENKINS TERESA JONES

appeared as witnesses herein and were examined and testified as follows:

### EXAMINATION

### BY MR. LAZARUS:

Q Would you each in turn state your name and your title, please?

A (Witness Dewbre) Norma Dewbre, Senior Shift Clerk, Operations.

- A (Witness Jenkins) Pauline Jenkins, Shift Clerk.
- A (Witness Jones) Teresa Jones, Shift Clerk.
- Q Okay, Norman, starting with you, could you tell us what you were doing on Tuesday the 20th, during the loss of power even?
- A (Witness Dewbre) Okay, I was in the service building, regular clerical functions, when the power went out. I went downstairs after they declared the emergency. I went into the control room to make sure that the ENN

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position was manned. When I went in there, Pauline was already in the process of getting set up for primary ENN communicator. Teresa was up there with here and also Alberta Anderson, who is another of our shift clerks, was there.

I checked with them to make sure if it was okay.

They appeared to have everything totally in control. I

backed out of the way to see whether I was needed or not,

was requested to do a job for John and then turned into be

more or less a go-fer for the period that I was there.

Whatever they needed, I did accountability, I ran some

errands back and forth from the TSC. Basically that's it.

Q Okay.

A (Witness Dewbre) I observed, kept my eye on the ENN function as time was going on, they appeared to be totally in control so I made no moves to intervene.

Q Okay, Pauline.

(Witness Jenkins) Where do you want me to start, from the time that --

Q From the time that the incident occurred, what you were asked to do and what you did.

A (Witness Jenkins) From the time that I noticed the incident occurred, I was in the OSOS's office, someone happened to open the door and I noticed that the lights were out in the control room portion, the back panels of the

control room. So at that time I heard that we had a reactor trip. And I left out, Teresa was in there also so we left out and I went around to the podium to get out necessary forms for the reactor trip. And at the time, that's all we thought it was, just a reactor trip.

So we proceeded to get the procedures and things that we needed. And during that time, one of the other clerks came down and she was naming the procedures that she thought we would need, so we started trying to get them. But we realized in the process that car cupy machine was down, so we sent one of the other clerks to the other building to get procedures done, copies done. I stayed in the control room to find out what was going to be needed. At that time, I just got out the forms, I went to the desk and got out the forms for an NUE notification because I thought we were going to have to make some form of notification, whether we had a trip or whatever. And I put them on the OS's desk so that they would be prepared for him when he got ready to fill them out. And I waited there in the control room down on the floor.

Q That was Mr. Hopkins?

A (Witness Jenkins) Yes. And after awhile, a lot of people had come down during that time, so we stood to the side waiting on further instructions as to what we were supposed to -- you know, what was going to be required of

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us. And someone came and said Bill wants you. So I went back up on the podlum and he was talking to Mr. Bockhold and I said yes, here I am, what is it. They didn't proceed to tell me anything, so I stood for a few minutes and nobody said anything, so I went back down and stood over to the side to wait for further instructions.

Then we noticed John filling out some type of a form, it looked like an NRC notification, so I went around the podium on the other side and came back up because I felt like if he was filling out NRC notification, it was time for me to assume my position and wait. So I went back up there on the podium and waited to get my forms to be filled out.

After waiting for several minutes, I did get the forms and proceeded to start doing my roll call -- my notification. That's when I realized that the form was dead.

Q Which form did they provide you? This was a notification of site area emergency?

A (Witness Jenkins) Yes. It was a form -- okay, the first form on top was the notification that it was not a drill, it was a real emergency. Then the next form so that it was a site area emergency.

Q And who did you get that form from?

A (Witness Jenkins) I got it from John Hopkins.

Q Were there any -- did Mr. Bockhold get involved in

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Did he make any changes to it before it finally went this? out?

(Witness Jenkins) Yes. As I was getting ready to A do my notification, I noticed -- I had just -- well when I got started doing my roll call, I realized that the phones were out and we proceeded to go to the back up which is only South Carolina. He asked to see the form, so I let him see it. And then I had to wait until he gave it back to me and I noticed that he had written another statement, had added another statement on the form saying that power had been restored at 0956.

So he just updated the information for you on the form?

- (Witness Jenkins) That was on the initial form.
- Did you tell anyone that the ENN, the normal ENN 0 phone system was not operational?
  - (Witness Jenkins) Yes.
  - Who did you tell that?

(Witness Jenkins) I don't remember who was standing behind me at the time, there was a supervisor up on that podium, I just can't remember which face it was, and at that time after I found out it didn't work, I just said the phone is not working so we went on to the backup.

Were you aware that the backup on'y provided notification to South Carolina at the time?

A (Witness Jenkins) If I'm not mistaken, the last training class we had -- I'm under the impression and I may be wrong, that when the forms were changed -- because we used to have another form -- when those forms were changed, everybody had the same form and you could get everybody at the same time. But now that I think about it, it may just be that it was just the form was changed and nothing else was changed.

- Q No, I think you're right, on the ENN you get everybody, but on the backup it's only South Carolina.
  - A (Witness Jenkins) Right.
- Q That's what I was asking if you were aware of that, because it apparently wasn't well known.
  - A (Witness Jenkins) No.
- Q Can you add anything, Terasa, to what Pauline has told us?

A (witness Jones) Well when she got the forms, I was with her the whole while the ENN was down and we told John that it was down and John told Richard Loftin to make notification because he was logging the stuff, that the ENN was down. So we proceeded -- we went to the backup then. Pauline, she got situated on that, doing the roll call and stuff, so I went and asked to do the on-site notification because I knew that had to be done also. So I came back over there and I just like on a little piece of paper wrote

down a brief description of what was going on and times so 2 when I notified the on-site agencies like Plant Wilson, as to what was going on -- so I called all of those and once I 3 finished that, she came over and said that she hadn't notified Burke County and GEMA and that's when we attempted 6 to get on the phone and notify them by the commercial 7 phones. So I dialed the number for her and she was -- I 8 thought she was on the phone with GEMA when I left because 9 the second notification came out, so I went over the backup 10 since the ENN was down, to start trying to make a second notification. And when I got to the second notifications, I 11 12 dialed 9-9 and only one agency picked up, which was 13 Barnwell. I had to call all the others by their separate 14 numbers. 15

While I was talking to one of the agencies on the separate number, I think it was --

Q Let me back up, you're on the South Carolina backup ENN now, you dial 9-9 and that's supposed to get everybody?

- A (Witness Jones) Right.
- A (Witness Jenkins) All of South Carolina.
- Q But only one answered?
- A (Witness Jones) Right.
- Q And that was --

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- A (Witness Jones) Barnwell.
- Q -- Barnwell.

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A (Witness Jones) So I had to proceed to use separate numbers to --

Q Who else should answer on it? I guess there are what, two counties?

A (Witness Jones) Allendale, Savannah River Site, State of South Carolina.

A (Witness Jenkins) All of South Carolina.

A (Witness Jones) When she called the first time, all of them picked up, she got all of them. When I called the second time, only one picked up, so I just went through and read notification to that one because I said nobody else picked up, I'm just going to read what I've got. Then I proceeded to go back through.

Q Which notification were you giving, this was the second?

- A (Witness Jones) Second.
- Q Did you have difficulty on the first notification?
- A (Witness Jenkins) With South Carolina?
- Q Yes.

A (Witness Jenkins) The only difficulty I had was in reading the information, they were sort of slow in I guess writing it down or whatever because I had to keep repeating different parts over and over, as far as the problems that was the only problem.

Q Okay, but as far -- at what point did you realize

that Georgia and I guess ..hat is it, Burke County -- GEMA and Burke County did not get notified?

A (Witness Jenkins) Okay, when I started doing my roll call, I did check, there's a little block on the form where you check if these agencies answer, and I put asterisks by the agencies that did not answer and it was Burke County and GPMA. So after I realized that they did not answer that way, that's when I said well I'll go to the commercial phones.

Q So you gave everybody who was on there the notification.

A (Witness Jenkins) Right.

Q And then you went to get GEMA and Burke County by commercial telephone?

A (Witness Jenkins) Right.

Q That was immediately after you hung up on the ENN?

A (Witness Jenkins) Yes. And then when I called, I tried to call GEMA first and the first number I dialed I did not get an answer. It was like buzz-buzz, but I didn't get an answer.

Q Like a busy signal?

A (Witness Jenkins) Yes. And the second number I called, as we were trying to call it, GEMA was on the phone to our control room and they were talking to Steve Douglas I believe, and he was relaying information from me to them,

and after ho hung up, we tried to call again, which Teresa called again.

Q Do you know about what time that was? When you said you were passing information through Steve to GEMA.

A (Witness Jenkins) No, I don't remember.

A (Witness Jones) The time that she initially tried to call them when she got all the other agencies, it should have been around about 10:14, 10:13 because I had just finished calling the on-site people. I know between about 10:15, somewhere in that time frame.

- Q This is still the first notification?
- A (Witness Jones) Right.

A (Witness Jenkins) I got Burke County at 10:16 and I had tried to get GEMA before I got Burke County. So as far as pinpointing the minute, I --

Q No, I don't think we can pinpoint the exact minutes on this. We've got George's logs and your logs and I think we're close enough to understand what happened.

The subsequent notification, notification number two, did you handle that in the same way by using the South Carolina ENN and then the commercial telephone to notify Georgia?

A (Witness Jenkins) Teresa made the second --

A (Witness Jones) I got ahold of all the agencies, which it took longer because I had to go through the phone

lines, but that makes about three times because I got one and then I got -- when I was talking to the second person, another person came in on the line, so that was two of them and then I had to call another one up, so it took three notifications, then as soon as I finished with them I proceeded to call GEMA. I got on the commercial phone and then when I talked to GEMA, I had to start with message one, that's what he said he wanted me to do.

Q Okay.

A (Witness Jones) So I gave him all three messages there together, and while I was talking to GEMA with the third message, that's when Alberta, the other clerk, came and she gave Burke County the second notification.

Q Did you become aware at any time during this that the Technical Support Center had ENN communication with everybody and that that system was operable there?

A (Witness Jenkins) We didn't know the Technical Support Center had come into operation until we heard it over -- we were still up on the podium because we heard them when they said they were giving a fourth message.

Q Yeal I think you're right about when they took over, but I just wanted to see if you were aware that the phones were working in there and apparently they knew the phones were working, they just didn't appear to communicate back and forth, it would have made it a lot easier.

THE REST NOOT OF THE

A (Witness Dewbre) I remember someone saying the phones were up but I thought it was after TSC had already taken over.

Q As it turns out the ENN in the TSC comes off a totally different power supply so it was never out, it worked fine throughout the whole thing. So if there was just some way that you could have transferred the information down there, they could have done it and you wouldn't have had to go through all the commercial phone calls. But that's one of the things that we've learned through this.

- A (Witness Dewbre) I didn't know.
- A (Witness Jone ) They're on separate lines?
- Q It's a separate power supply for the telephone.
- A (Witness Jenkins) Evidently because I remember Elmo Pickett -- we had finished ours.

A (Witness Jones) Ours didn't come up until afterwards and we had to do three messages, so --

A (Witness Jenkins) We had done those three and then we --

Q And they're only like 50 feet away, it would have been a lot easier.

- A (Witness Jones) Right.
- Q Is there anything that you can add that I haven't asked you or anything that -- I think I've got a pretty good

picture of how things went. Norma?

A (Witness Dewbre) One thing struck me, when Pauline started talking -- I think it's immaterial but just to be sure for the record, you asked me where I was at and I was upstairs when the lights went out. I came downstairs before they declared the emergency and we were all standing and waiting and I was kind of trying to observe to see what was happening and what was going to happen. That's when I ran the errand for John and then I came back and by the time I came back, they had declared and they were in their positions.

MR. LAZARUS: Okay. Can you think of anything, Gene?

MR. TRAGER: No, I can't.

MR. LAZARUS: Thanks very much, ladies, I appreciate, it, it was very helpful.

(Whereupon, the interview was concluded at 11:12 a.m.)
