MR. LAZARUS: The date is March 27, 1990, 2:38 p.m.,
we're performing an interview at the Vogtle plant with John
Stanley, Elmer Pickett, Doug Daughhetee and Dan Hines, who
are Technical Support Center communicators.

6 Whereupon,

JOHN STANLEY ELMER PICKETT DOUG DAUGHHETEE DAN HINES

appeared as witnesses herein and were examined and testified as follows:

#### EXAMINATION

BY MR. LAZARUS:

Q For the record will each of you in turn state your name and your title?

A (Witness Stanley) My name is John Stanley, I'm a Senior Plant Engineer and ENN communicator for the TSC.

A (Witness Pickett) My name is Elmer Pickett, I'm a Senior Engineer I and during the emergency I was the primary communicator, ENN in the TSC.

A (Witness Daughhetee) My name is Doug Daughhetee, my title 's also Senior Engineer I, I think under the new org chart and I'm a TSC ENN communicator.

A (Witness Hines) Dan Hines. We always call ourselves Senior Plant Engineer -- Senior Engineer I -- and

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during the event I was a TSC ENN communicator.

Q Okay, thank you. John, I guess starting with you, would you just tell us in your own words -- give us a narrative of what happened, where you were when the incident

occurred with -- on Tuesday regarding the loss of vital

power and what you did?

A (Witness Stanley) Okay, I was actually in the plant when it occurred. I had gone into a room where we were working the valves and I first realized something was wrong when I couldn't card back out of the door. Evidently it was within the time when it first happened and the security diesel hadn't come back up. So I waited there a few minutes until my card would scan to let me out of the room. I was probably delayed there a minute. Then when I came out, I noticed an operator running toward the diesel.

Last week I was the duty engineer for the week, so I went to the control room to see what was going on. I went in the Unit 2 control room which on the way walking I heard some people say Unit 2 had tripped. So I went to the Unit 2 control room to see if there was anybody that I needed to get or -- you know, serving my function as a duty engineer. And while I was there, I got sent back to the office to find Mr. Kochery, the supervisor over the diesel. And it was while I had come back to the office that the alert was declared.

We left then and went to the TSC.

(Witness Stanley) Right. And it probably took us

two or three minutes to get there. The announcement came

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got there and were setting up. Then after Elmer, Doug and - they were there, just right behind or at the same time we
were. Then Elmer started, you know, making sure we had
contact with the ENN -- you know, the ENN was active. And
he got some of the parties I know and then after we had been
there awhile, we realized that things weren't -- we weren't
hearing any announcements over the ENN, which there's a
speaker on the table and if somebody talks, even if you're
not on the phone, you can hear it and we weren't hearing
anything.

Q So you expected to be hearing conversations from the

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control room?

A (Witness Stanley) Right, normally we do that. And what we do in drills is we will have a sheet there and we will record what they say so when we have to do our first notification, we'll have that information already laid out, so we'll know what they have already said. We never do the first notification from the TSC.

Q Let me clarify one thing. You're all on the same phone circuit here at the ENN?

A (Witness Stanley) Well there's only one person actually doing the talking.

Q When it started out that was you?

A (Witness Stanley) No, it started out with Elmer. See normally us four, there are two normal ENN communicators and two alternates. So -- but when we have -- you know, when there's an announcement, everybody goes because you don't --

Q Okay, why don't we shift to you, Elmer, since you were the one who was initially talking on the phone.

A (Witness Pickett) I guess when Unit 2 tripped or when the incident occurred, I was in the service building, third floor, I was at my desk. The power went out and some people left. I think our supervisor came back and told us - Paul came back and told us what had happened, a truck had backed over the pole.

The time period that elapsed I'm unsure about, but I left with another engineer, we were going to look at the incident out in the switch yard. We went down the stairway, as I exited the door of the service building, that's when the plant page came out for the -- stating the site area emergency.

Q Do you remember about what time that was?

A (Witness Pickett) I'm unclear as to the -- it was close to 10:00, I don't know exactly what time, I didn't really look at my clock to really establish time.

Q When you speak times are you talking Eastern Standard time?

A (Witness Pickett) Yes, I'm talking Eastern time. I was the first one of these guys in the control room because I was already headed out that way and when I got in the control room -- excuse me, the TSC -- there were no chairs there so I went to locate some chairs for us. When I got back I think John and Doug were there and I think Dan was there too. I hadn't found any chairs so John was still there, Doug and myself left to try to locate some other furniture. We went to another area of the control building and we found some chairs and brought them back. When I got back, I think that's about the time that I made the communications check which is something that we just normally do in case we have to give any messages.

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Q I'm pretty sure that I haven't seen that. That would be -- I would like to get a copy of that if you can get me a copy.

A (Witness Stanley) Lawrence may have -- we made him a copy of it, he's the emergency preparedness guy.

Q I'll get a copy, don't worry about it.

A (Witness Pickett) I made a communications check over the ENN and it was functioning at that point.

Q Who did you make that check with?

A (Witness Pickett) What I do is I just request a roll call of all the various agencies. just to make sure that they're there and if we're going to anticipate any problems reaching an agency, then we would have to make additional phone calls.

Q All the agencies answered?

A (Witness Pickett) Initially all but three and we called them up on the phone and made phone contact with them and directed them to standby the ENN for messages.

Q Do you know who those three were?

A (Witness Pickett) If I was looking at the form I could tell you. I think GEMA may have been one, Burke County and one county from South Carolina, I'm not sure of.

Q So even on the ENN when you had -- when you pick up the ENN it will ring in all these locations?

A (Witness Pickett) Right -- well it won't ring, the

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speaker will just -- you know, when I talk through the phone, it will just --

- A (Witness Daughhetee) It's a live circuit.
- A (Witness Pickett) Yeah, it's a live circuit.
- Q So there's no ringing.

A (Witness Stanley) Well I don't know what it does in these other places, but like at our station it's just a voice box and you know, we keep the sound turned way up. I don't think it rings anywhere.

A (Witness Pickett) If they have the same circuits we have.

A (Witness Hines) I thought you could pick it up and dial numbers and we had codes in there that you could get it to ring at a location.

- A (Witness Stanley) That's the backup.
- A (Witness Hines) That's the backup. Okay.
- Q So you called the three that didn't answer up on the ENN on regular commercial telephone?

A (Witness Pickett) Right. Right around this time I think we were getting -- I got a note from Brent Quick and also some kind of notification from Esther Dickson, I think she was Mr. Kitchen's secretary there, that GEMA was not receiving -- or had contacted and said they were not receiving ENN.

Q That was at the EOF that that contact was made?

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A (Witness Pickett) I don't know how they got through to us, but I just received a sticky pad scribbling from Brent Quick saying that GEMA had not received the message -- or had received a partial message -- that one I'm unclear.

A (Witness Stanley) Wasn't that the guy from Burke County though, Elmer, wasn't that Earl Potterfield.

- A (Witness Pickett) Earl Potterfield.
- A (Witness Stanley) I think he's Burke County,
- A (Witness Pickett) Okay, well that's who contacted Brent Quick and I called him up.
  - Q Who is Brent Quick?
- A (Witness Pickett) Brent Quick is the -- he's the TSC coordinator for I guess administrative duties such as making copies of forms and drawings and procedures.
- Q At this time though you had GEMA and Burke County on the ENN, you had called them and they had come up on the ENN?
- A (Witness Pickett) I called them and I'm still unsure of the three agencies. I remember there being three agencies not responding initially but they all came up.
  - Q Within a matter of a couple of minutes after you --
- A (Witness Pickett) After we called them up and we directed them to go to the ENN.
- Q So essentially everyone at that point was on the line.

A (Witness Pickett) The ENN was working at that 2 point. 3 And it was after that point that you got this call from someone else saying that GEMA had not been notified of 5 the event? 6 (Witness Pickett) I received a note from somebody 7 in the TSC saying that GEMA had not been notified or had received partial notification. 8 9 (Witness Stanley) One thing that Elmer's talking 10 about, he wasn't making notification, he was just making 11 sure --12 Q Yeah, I understand that. You did not receive any complaints directly over the ENN from Georgia or Burke 13 14 County regarding lack of notification? 15 A (Witness Pickett) No. 16 (Witness Daughhetee) I did. 17 You did? Would you share that with us? (Witness Daughhetee) Yes. This is Doug 18 Daughhetee. I won't recapitulate the whole story of going 19 20 down to the TSC unless I need to --21 Ho. 22 (Witness Daughhetee) As Elmer and I manned the phones there, Elmer began communications check as he has 23 described. I was getting the materials out to make up 24 message forms and one of the things we were trying to 25

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establish was what the status was of earlier notifications. We did not know at that point how many notifications had been made, you know, what the status was of the control room notifications. So we were in the process of elaborating on that and I believe at that time, Elmer was in contact by plant phone with the control room speaking with --

A (Witness Pickett) I talked to Steve Douglas initially.

A (Witness Daughhetee) And it was during the period that Elmer was on the phone that I heard over the ENN GEMA calling, asking for Vogtle to come up. I answered them, I don't recall the person from GEMA's name, but he was asking why GEMA had not been notified over the ENN. This was news to me, I did not know why, I couldn't tell him why because presumably they would have been notified by the control room. We did not know -- I did not know yet that the control room had not contacted them over the ENN.

(Brief pause.)

Q Okay go ahead.

A (Witness Daughhetee) I responded to the fellow from GEMA that we would attempt to find out, we would get in contact with the control room and have them get on the ENN or find out why. And I mentioned that to Elmer who was on the phone with Steve at the time. And on the other end of the phone, presumably Steve I think was trying to find out

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from the control room ENN communicator what was going on. I wasn't getting any immediate answers back and the fellow from GEMA came on again and I couldn't give him -- the GEMA person knew pretty much what our situation was, as a matter of fact, GEMA had gotten South Carolina to fax them a copy of the notification message that South Carolina had received.

- Q How do you know that, did they tell you that?
- A (Witness Daughhetee) He told me that.
- Q This is GEMA that told you?

A (Witness Daughhetee) GEMA told me that. I still had no official information to give him. At this point, I believe the TSC had been -- probably had been activated but control had not been transferred from the control room to the TSC. I believe there is a log entry in the ENN log as to when TSC was activated and as I recall from the entry I made in the ENN log, this is like 10:27 or so I made an entry to the effect that GEMA had contacted us over the ENN. I made that entry, there was some other information in the entry and the actual GEMA contact was probably somewhat earlier like 10:20, 10:23, somewhere in that time phase. By 10:27 I had made an entry in the log.

Because we were not getting information forthcoming from the control room immediately reassuring us that yes, they were getting ahold of GEMA and GEMA was not -- we

weren't hearing anything go out over the ENN, I picked up the South Carolina back up ENN which does not have a speaker phone, it's just a handset, and I picked it up and monitored it and heard the control room ENN communicator making a third message. That was the first point that we were at the point of the third message. And she continued through the third message and when she got to the end of it she called roll and she included Burke County and GEMA on her roll call and of course was not receiving any response since those agencies do not monitor that tem. So I came on the backup ENN at that point and vised her that she needed to contact GEMA and Burke County through other means, that they were not on that system.

It was sometime subsequent to that that control was formally transferred to the TSC and we were given a message -- we were given authorization to send a message, so we sent the fourth message, Elmer was the one who actually read the message over the ENN and we had all five -- more than that -- we had all seven agencies responding on ENN for that message that was made from the TSC.

- Q So the fourth message was the first one that you sent out from the TSC, right?
  - A (Witness Daughhetee) Yes.
- Q At any point -- I guess when did it become obvious to you that the control room ENN wasn't functioning? When

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you were liscening in on the ENN at that point?

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A (Witness Daughhetee) Yeah.

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Q Or the backup ENN?

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control room wasn't using the ENN for their messages but it

(Witness Daughhetee) Yeah, it was obvious that the

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became really apparent that there was a glitch here when I monitored the backup ENN and found that they were using that

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and were apparently unaware that Georgia and Burke County

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were not receiving that. I would have presumed prior to

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that that if they were not using the ENN, that they were

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contacting the Georgia agencies through other means.

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Q Which is what they were trying to do, they were

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trying to notify them by commercial telephone.

about ten minutes or so, I mentioned to Skip that, you know,

(Witness Stanley) I mentioned to -- I guess after

we weren't hearing anything on the ENN. That was before we

17 knew about the backup being used and he said that the

18 control room had made notification and I assume he had been

in contact. So I guess we didn't really know what was going

on there at the start.

A (Witness Pickett) Yeah.

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A (Witness Daughhetee) Yeah, we advised Skip that we

23 were capable of sending the message but the presumption was

that the control room was handling messages at that point

and we weren't required at that point.

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Q Just as an aside, until this rorning, the control room communicators didn't realize that the ENN in the TSC was functional and you're only 50 feet away. If they had known that, they could have walked the message down, but they just didn't realize that.

A (Witness Stanley) Well that's the same thing, we could have just as easily gone into them, we're right there. We would have had to go out and around but --

A (Witness Daughhetee) You know, our badges aren't authorized to go through the back door of the control room.

A (Witness Hines) I've got that privilege.

A (Witness Stanley) We just didn't realize what the situation was really.

A (Witness Hines) As a matter of fact, we offered to go get them, or I did, you know, if they wanted us to go get the information, that we would go get them.

Right then we were interested in getting the old sheet so we'd know what had been said before.

Q Right.

A (Witness Hines) And we could try to maintain some consistency.

MR. LAZARUS: Anything else you can add? BY MR. LAZARUS:

Q At that point I guess once the fourth message went out from the TSC, communications were I guess normal.

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(Witness Stanley) Back to normal.

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(Witness Daughhetee) Yeah, we had no problem. We sent four messages from the TSC I think.

Anything you'd like to add, Dan? 0

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(Witness Hines) No, not on the communications issue. Basically what I took the job was of just getting the sheets filled out, getting the Emergency Director to sign them and handing them to Elmer to send out over the

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phone.

(Witness Daughhetee) I might add, during this time period I was on the phone several times with Sandra Threatt of South Carolina DHEC who called with questions and so I was handling that. We kind of had a division of labor there with Elmer reading the actual forms. Once everybody on the other end had Elmer's name down there was no reason to present them with mine, so we let Elmer stay with that job and I handled the phones and talking to South Carolina and Dan gathered data.

What did you do, John?

(Witness Stanley) Like I say, I was sort of standing by because I was expecting calls as duty engineer, so I didn't -- I was really just there.

A (Witness Pickett) John was basically -- he was standing there but he was just trying to get an overall picture of everything to make sure that we were doing

everything that we were supposed to be doing.

Q Were there any communications issues with the offsite, things went pretty smoothly according to the emergency
plan -- any problems with the procedures or anything that
you can remember?

A (Witness Stanley) Once we started, it went real smooth. I think we got everybody's attention which sometimes during a drill is hard to -- you know, people will go away but with this, everybody was right there I think.

Q Did you have a lot of problems because it wasn't a drill, were people asking you to repeat the information, did it slow things down a lot?

A (Witness Pickett) Not really.

A (Witness Daughhetee) They didn't -- what they did, instead of asking Elmer to repeat things over the ENN, like I said, I got calls back by commercial telephone from DHEC asking questions. There was some confusion because we were noting that Unit 2 reactor had tripped, but we were declaring an emergency on Unit 1. They didn't understand that and I tried to explain that.

Q Anything else?

A (Witness Hines) This is rather small, there was initially some concern over the meteorological information that we were getting because the ERF computer was not functional when we started to make our notifications. The

I will get that, I'm going to talk to Mr. Roberts later today and I'll ask him to get those things for me.

MR. LAZARUS: Thank you very much, I appreciate it, it was helpful.

(Whereupon, the interview was concluded at 3:02 p.m.)
