#### 2. 30703 - Exit Interview

The inspector met with licensee representatives (denoted in Paragraph 1) at the conclusion of the inspection on April 19, 1984. At that time, the purpose and scope of the inspection were reviewed and the findings presented. At no time during this inspection was written material provided to the licensee by the inspector.

# 3. 81480 - General Requirements for Special Nuclear Materials of Moderate Strategic Significance

The licensee was protecting special nuclear material in conformance with the physical security plan. The physical security plan met the general performance requirements and objectives of the governing regulations.

## 4. 92706 - Independent Inspection Effort

Licensee security representatives briefed the inspector on some planned improvements to the security program. These changes will be evaluated by the licensee for inclusion in the approved physical security plan under the provisions of 10 CFR 50.54(p), as appropriate. The inspector briefed the licensee on the use of the provisions of 10 CFR 2.790(d) to protect correspondence and reports to or from the NRC which contain information or records concerning a licensee's physical protection or material control and accounting program for special nuclear material not otherwise designated as Safeguards Information or classified as National Security Information or Restricted Data.
