SUBJECT: NRC INSPECTION REPORT NOS. 50-445/92-03; 50-446/92-03 (NOTICE OF VIOLATION)

This refers to the inspection conducted by Messrs. D. N. Graves, R. M. Latta, and C. E. Johnson during the period January 8 through February 1, 1992, of activities authorized for the Comanche Peak Steam Electric Station, Units 1 and 2. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with you and those members of your staff identified in the enclosed report.

Areas examined during the inspection included routine plant tours, action on previous inspection findings, followup on corrective actions for violations, licensee action on construction deficiencies and NRC Bulletins, preoperational test program implementation verification, instrumentation components and systems, and corrective actions.

Relative to the areas inspected, two strengths were identified. Specifically, excellent communications were demonstrated between operations and startup personnel during the conduct of dynamic motor-operated valve testing (paragraph 7). It was also determined that the licensee had effectively developed and implemented a comprehensive corrective action program for the resolution of identified construction deficiencies associated with heating, ventilation, and air-conditioning duct and duct supports (paragraph 5.2).

However, based on the results of this inspection, certain of your activities were in violation of NRC requirements, as specified in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice). This violation is of concern because it involves inadequate control of ASME Code, Class I components (i.e., pressurizer spray valves).

You are required to respond to this letter and should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice when preparing your response. In your response, you should document the specific actions taken and any additional actions you plan to prevent recurrence. After reviewing your response to this Notice, including your proposed corrective actions and the results of future
