As was specified on February 21, 1992, at the close of the first phase of the adjudicatory hearing in this proceeding (see Tr. 1315-18), it is

ORDERED, that the NRC staff shall file any written rebuttal testimony on or before <u>March 13, 1992</u>; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that licensee Alabama Power Company (APCo) shall file any written surrebuttal testimony on or before <u>April 6, 1992</u>; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that motions to strike/motions in limine relative to the parties' written rebuttal or surrebuttal testimony shall be filed on or before <u>April 16</u>, <u>1992</u>, and that responses to such motions shall be filed on or before <u>April 27</u>, <u>1992</u>; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that on or before March 6, 1992, APCo shall submit a report to the Board outlining the nature and results of its efforts to ascertain the status on November 30, 1985, of 1) the levels of silicone oil in the GEMS level transmitters whose qualification is at issue in the proceeding, and 2) the lubricant being utilized in the containment fan motors and room coolers outside containment whose qualification is at issue in this proceeding; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED, that on or before <u>March 6, 1992</u>, each party shall file a listing of any proposed corrections to the transcripts for the February 11-14, 1992 and February 18-21, 1992 hearing sessions and that any objections to those proposed corrections shall be filed on or before <u>March</u> 18, 1992.

Service of the staff's rebuttal testimony and APCO's surrebuttal testimony upc. the Board and opposing counsel shall be by overnight express mail or other comparable method. Copies of APCO's report to the Board on the November 30, 1985 status of certain Farley equipment and of any motion to strike/motion in limine and any response thereto shall be provided to the Board and opposing counsel by facsimile or other method that will ensure receipt by close of business (4:30 p.m. EST/EDT) on the designated filing date. (A copy of APCo's report to the Board and of any motion to strike/motion in limine and any response thereto also should be sent to Judge Morris at his service

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address by overnight express mail or other comparable method.)

On or before <u>March 2, 1992</u>, the parties should provide the Board with a listing that identifies those premarked APCo exhibits that duplicate staff exhibits already admitted into evidence. In preparing their rebuttal and surrebuttal testimony, the parties should avoid duplication relative to any additional premarked exhibits they provide in support of that testimony.

As previously ordered, the evidentiary hearing relative to the parties' rebuttal and surrebuttal testimony is scheduled to begin on <u>May 18, 1992, at 9:00 a.m. in the</u> <u>Commission's hearing room, Fifth Floor, West Tower, East-</u> <u>West Towers Building, 4350 East-West Highway, Bethesda,</u> <u>Maryland</u>, and will continue each weekday (holidays excepted) until concluded.
