This refers to the inspection conducted by Mr. Lewis of this office on July 14, 1971, of decommissioning activities authorized by AEC letter dated May 27, 1971, and to the discussion of our findings held by our inspector with Messrs. Dold and Kim of your staff at the conclusion of the inspection.

Areas examined during this inspection included the transfer records for the irradiated fuel and control assemblies, the transfer records for the control rod drives, and the sales contract and shipping records of the two Lockheed four reactors. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with facility personnel and observations by the inspector.

Within the scope of this inspection, no items of noncompliance were detected.

LICENSE TERMINATION ORDER

The Atomic Energy Commission ("the Commission") has found that the Lockheed Aircraft Corporation's Radiation Effects Reactor located in Dawson County, Georgia, has been partially dismantled and disposition made of the component parts, and other special nuclear and byproduct materials (pursuant to the Commission's Order dated May 27, 1971), in accordance with the Commission's regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I, and in a manner not inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public. Any radioactive material remaining as contaminants at the Radiation Effects Facility will be licensed concurrently with issuance of this order by the State of Georgia under a byproduct material license.

Accordingly, pursuant to the applications dated April 12, 1971, and June 17, 1971, from Lockheed Aircraft Corporation, Facility License No. B-86 is hereby terminated as of the date of this order.

Also, Indemnity Agreement No. B-24 between Lockheed Aircraft Corporation and the Atomic Energy Commission dated July 20, 1962, as amended, is hereby terminated as of the date of this order and concurrently Amendment No. 6 to Indemnity Agreement B-24 is being executed.
