The Atomic Energy Commission ("the Commission") has found that the Lockheed Aircraft Corporation's Radiation Effects Reactor located in Dawson County, Georgia, has beempertially dismantled and disposition made of the component parts, and other special nuclear and byproduct materials (pursuant to the Commission's Order dated May 27, 1971), in accordance with the Commission's regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I, and in a manner not immical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public. Any radioactive material remaining as contaminants at the Radiation Effects Facility will be licensed concurrently with issuance of this order by the State of Georgia under a byproduct material license.

Accordingly, pursuant to the applications dated April 12, 1971, and June 17, 1971, from Lockheed Aircraft Corporation, Pacility License No. R-86 is hereby terminated as of the date of this order.
