APPLICANTS' MOTION TO COMPEL
STATE OF LOUISIANA AND JOINT INTERVENORS
TO RESPOND TO APPLICANTS' INTERROGATORIES
ON SAFETY CONTENTIONS 1 & 2

Pursuant to Sections 2.730(h) and 2.740(f) of the Commission's Rules of Practice, Gulf States Utilities Company, et al., ("Applicants") move to compel the State of Louisiana and Joint Intervenors to respond to Applicants' interrogatories on safety contentions 1 & 2, dated June 5, 1984.^{1/} To summarize, Applicants' interrogatories requested that the State of Louisiana and Joint Intervenors identify the factual and expert witnesses and the documents on which they intend to rely at the hearings, scheduled to commence on October 10, 1984.^{2/} The interrogatories further requested that the State of Louisiana and Joint Intervenors provide


the substantive information on which Contentions 1 & 2 are based.

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
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
