#### AFFIDAVIT OF DENNIS M. CRUTCHFIELD

I, Dennis M. Crutchfield, being duly sworn, do depose and state:

1. I am employed by the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission as Chief, Operating Reactors Branch No. 5, Division of Licensing, Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation. As set forth in my previous affidavits filed before the Atomic Safety and Licensing Appeal Board in this proceeding, I have been assigned lead responsibility for coordinating the NRC Staff's review and resolution of outstanding issues pertaining to Waterford Unit 3, including issues related to the facility's foundation base mat.

2. In my affidavit of June 14, 1984, I indicated that the Staff's review of base mat-related issues was substantially complete, although further efforts were required before the Staff could file its views concerning the foundation base mat. I further indicated that the team of consultants and reviewers which had been considering certain base mat issues (cutside the scope of the allegation review being conducted at the site) was discussing its preliminary conclusions with other members

8407090332 840705 PDR ADDCK 05000382 0 PDR of the Staff, and that it had not vet prepared a final written evaluation of the issues which it had under review. Finally, I indicated that the Staff anticipated that its technical review of base mat issues would be completed by June 29, 1984, and that its views could be presented to the Appeal Board by July 6, 1984.

3. The Staff's review of these matters has continued to progress during the period since my previous affidavit was filed. At the same time, two developments have occurred which affect the Staff's scheduled filing of its views in this regard. First, in discussions held on July 2 and 3, 1984, new information was provided to the Staff by the Applicant's consultants concerning the margin in the base mat for shear in the event of a design basis earthquake; this information corrects certain information previously provided by the Applicant in April 1984, and affects the Staff's base mat review. Secondly, as a result of a number of discussions held by the Applicant and Staff concerning this matter, the Applicant is undertaking certain confirmatory non-destructive testing of the base mat; this testing is scheduled to commence on July 10, 1984 and is expected to be completed by July 20, 1984.

4. As reported previously, the Staff's review of base mat-related issues is substantially complete, although further efforts are required before the Staff can file its response to the pending motion to reopen. The Staff and its consultants are currently engaged in preparing written evaluations of the base mat issues they reviewed; these evaluations have

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not yet been completed, and will require certain modifications in order to consider the new information provided earlier this week by the Applicant. Moreover, the Staff wishes to obtain at least a preliminary understanding of the results of the confirmatory non-destructive examination, scheduled to commence next week and to be completed by July 20, 1984, before it files its conclusions. Based upon the above, the Staff anticipates that its views concerning the base mat can be presented to the Appeal Board by July 27, 1984.
