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SUBJECT: INSERVICE INSPECTION AND TESTING PROGRAM - RELIEF FROM ASME BOILER AND PRESSURE VESSEL CODE, SECTION XI

By letter dated September 30, 1983, we granted relief, on an interim basis until September 26, 1984, from those inservice testing requirements of the ASME Code for the pumps and valves that you requested. Our review of your relief request is not yet complete and the basis for granting the current interim relief has not changed. We still agree on an interim basis with you that certain code testing requirements are impractical. Therefore, pursuant to 10 CFR 50.55a(g)(6)(i), we grant relief, on an interim basis until September 26, 1985, from those inservice testing requirements of the ASME Code for the pumps and valves that you requested.
