MEMORANDUM (CASE'S MOTION REGARDING J.J. LIPINSKY)

On October 6, 1984, Citizens Association for Sound Energy (CASE) moved to "refuse" Applicants' Motion for Summary Disposition of September 29, 1984, concerning the Trip Report of J.J. Lipinsky. We interpret CASE's motion to be a response to the Motion for Summary Disposition and to amount to a request for an extension of time in which to respond to the Summary Disposition motion. Since we consider the Summary Disposition motion to be too narrowly focused, because it addresses only one narrow subissue of the coatings program, we grant CASE's motion and will permit it to defer its response until after the quality of coatings is ripe for determination as a single, integrated issue. In particular, we do not anticipate requiring CASE to respond to motions relating to this issue until after the Brookhaven National Laboratory's report on coatings is issued.

ORDER

For all the foregoing reasons and based on consideration of the entire record in this matter, it is this 10th day of October 1984

ORDERED:

That Citizens Association for Sound Energy (CASE) need not respond to Applicants' September 29, 1984 motion for summary disposition until after the entire coatings issue is ripe for determination. We will thereafter set an appropriate response date on motion.
