Dear Ms. Bernabei:

The Staff's interrogatories to TMIA (NRC Staff's Interrogatories and Document Request to TMIA, October 11, 1984) which were hand-delivered to you today are designed to elicit information concerning alleged inadequacies and deficiencies regarding the NRC's investigation into information flow, as it relates to the Dieckamp mailgram issue, and the resulting report, NUREG-0760, published in January, 1981. It may not be clear that the requested information is sought regarding all drafts of NUREG-0760 as well as the final NUREG-0760. I request that you interpret Definition B.1. ("NUREG-0760") to include all drafts of NUREG-0760, and consider the interrogatories amended accordingly. This is particularly important with respect to Interrogatories Nos. 5, 6, and 16.

As you know, I telephoned you today and provided this information to you. You responded that because you had not read the interrogatories, it was inappropriate for me to ask your agreement. As I told you, I called you simply to provide you the earliest possible notice of the intent of, and amendment to, the interrogatories, noting that the Licensing Board has asked the parties to cooperate on discovery and avoid the filing of unnecessary papers. I regret that you chose to attribute improper motive to my telephone call, and am therefore formally amending the Staff's interrogatories with this letter.
