
Dear Mr. Beckham:

By letter dated February 3, 1994, you requested the NRC staff to review a revised scope of the motor-operated valve (MOV) program developed in response to Generic Letter (GL) 89-10, "Safety-Related Motor-Operated Valve Testing and Surveillance." Based on your review of the GL 89-10 program, you have reclassified several MOVs as not having a safety function or having a safety function in only one operating direction (either opening or closing). By letter dated March 14, 1995, you responded to the staff's request for additional information dated February 13, 1995.

We have reviewed your submittals and our safety evaluation (SE) is enclosed. Our review focused on determining whether the reclassified valve active safety functions are consistent with the safety functions required to accommodate the design-basis events and transients. Based on this review, the staff disagrees with your reclassification of the following valve groups: residual heat removal (RHR) torus suction, core spray suction, high pressure coolant injection (HPCI) suppression pool suction, RHR and core spray minimum flow, low pressure coolant injection (LPCI) outboard injection, RHR full-flow test line, reactor core isolation cooling (RCIC) trip/throttle, containment spray, recombiner system, and emergency core cooling system (ECCS) containment isolation. Additional justification for reclassifying these valves, as discussed in the enclosed SE, is needed for further evaluation.

Furthermore, as discussed in the enclosed SE, the staff disagrees with the current safety classification of the LPCI outboard injection valve, and the RCIC trip/throttle valve. The safety functions to open for these two valves should be added to the scope of GL 89-10 program or additional justification should be provided.
