They should also bring with them their resumes and statement of qualifications.

3. All persons involved in the preparation of the portions of the SALP Report of April 2, 1984, described at NUREG-0680, Supp. 5, p. 7-14, related to GPU training, including those who did the reviews and evaluations and those, if different, who drafted the relevant sections of the SALP.

They should bring with them all documentation of that review, including but not limited to to notes, draft and final reports, and input to reports, memoranda, interview notes, evaluations, and any and all other documentation. They should also bring with them their resumes and statement of qualifications.

4. All persons involved in the preparation of the Operational Readiness Evaluation of TMI-1 licensed personnel (February 8 and 9, 1984), described at NUREG-0680, Supp. 5, p. 7-14, including those who did the reviews, interviews, and evaluations, and those, if different, who drafted the evaluation.

They should bring with them all documentation of that review, including but not limited to to notes, draft and final reports, and input to reports, memoranda, interview notes, evaluations, and any and all other documentation. This includes, but is not limited to, the notes and evaluations of interviews with 26 licensed operators, the questions asked in those interviews, and the answers given. They should also bring with them their resumes and statement of qualifications.

Except as otherwise agreed, these depositions will be taken in the order stated above at the offices of UCS' attorneys, Harmon, Weiss, & Jordan, 2001 S Street, N.W., Suite 430, Washington, D.C. The first deposition will begin at 10:00 a.m.

on Monday, October 29, 1984, and the depositions will continue thereafter until they are completed.
