17. QUALITY ASSURANCE

17.2 Organization for the QA Program

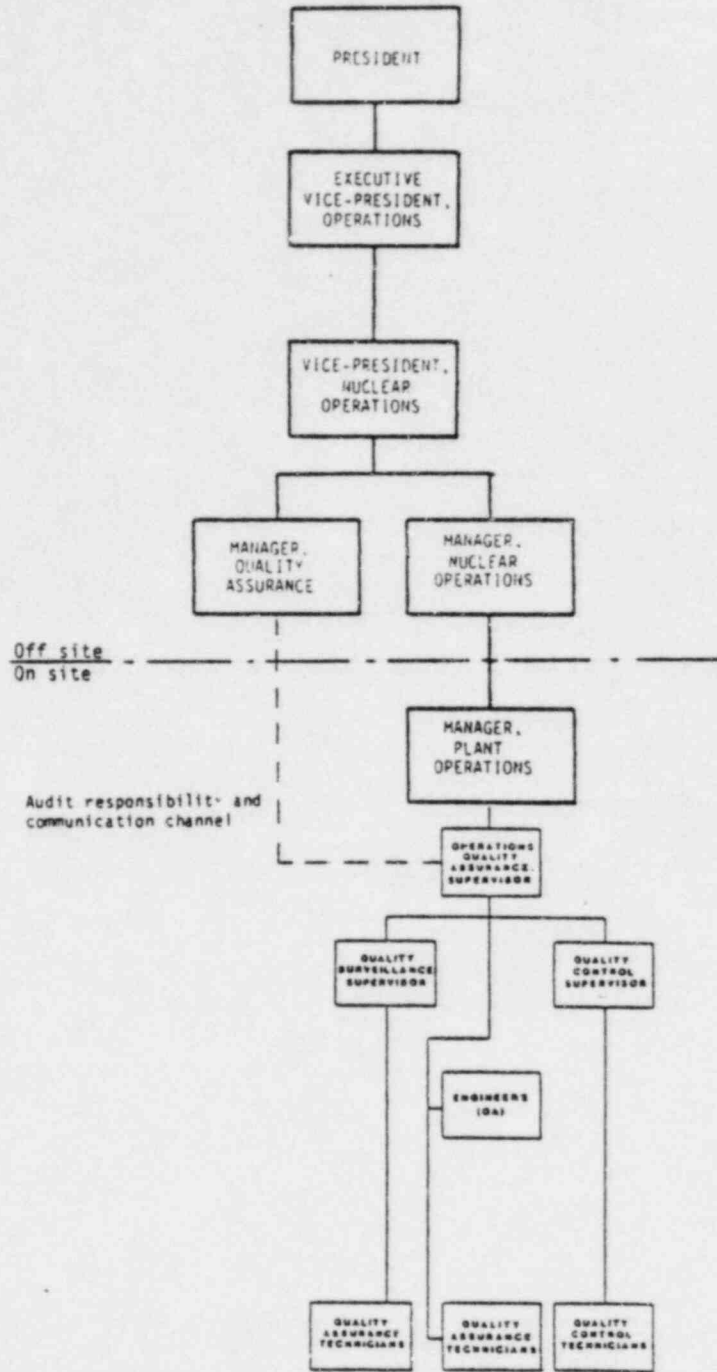


Figure 17.1 Comanche Peak Quality Assurance Organization

In Section 17.2 of the SER and in SSER 4 (November 1983), the staff presented its assessment of the applicants' organization responsible for the operational quality assurance (QA) for Comanche Peak and the establishment of the operations phase QA program. In FSAR Amendments 46 and 49, the applicant updated its organization by changing some position titles and revising the organization under the Operations Quality Assurance Supervisor. Figure 17.1 reflects the applicants' organization for operational QA as provided through FSAR Amendment 49. The staff finds that this organization, which adds a Quality Surveillance Supervisor and a Quality Control Supervisor under the Operations Quality Assurance Supervisor and (not shown on chart) increases the number of technicians under the Operations Quality Assurance Supervisor, will enhance the QA program for Comanche Peak.

17.4 Conclusion

In Section 17.4 of SSER No. 4 (November 1984), the staff reported on the acceptability of the description of the applicant's operations phase QA program and the items to which the program applies. Since that time the FSAR has undergone Amendments 42 through 49 with changes made to Appendix 1A(B) (which describes commitments to NRC Regulatory Guides), Section 13.1 (which describes the applicant's organizational structure), Section 17.2 (which describes the QA program for the operating phase), and Appendix 17A (which is the list of systems, structures, and components under the control of the QA program). In summary, the changes clarify the operations phase QA program and/or enhance the applicants' commitments to comply with NRC regulations.

The staff has reviewed changes made to the applicants' QA program description by these amendments and concludes that the changes are acceptable and that the FSAR continues to describe a QA program which complies with Appendix B to 10 CFR Part 50.
