South Carolina Electric & Gas Company (SCE&G) is submitting this special report pursuant to the requirements of Technical Specification 6.9.2 as required by Action 30 of specification 3.3.3.1, Table 3.3-6, Item 2.d.ii.

On October 13, 1995, at 2030 hours, the Main Steam Radiation Monitor, RMG-19B, was declared inoperable due to spiking above the high radiation setpoint four times within thirty minutes. A preplanned alternate method of monitoring the appropriate parameters was established as required by Action 30 of Technical Specification 3.3.3.1. Trouble-shooting of this instrumentation failed to reveal a cause for the spiking. RMG-19B was subsequently placed online and monitored for additional spiking. On October 17, 1995, an operability test was performed on RMG-19B and the monitor was declared operable on October 18, 1995.
