SUBJECT: NRC INSPECTION REPORT 50-285/95-17 AND NOTICE OF VIOLATION

This refers to the inspection conducted by R. Mullikin of this office on September 5-12, and October 10-19, 1995, at the Fort Calhoun Station facility. The purpose of the inspection was to determine whether activities authorized by the license were conducted safely and in accordance with NRC requirements. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with you and those members of your staff identified in the enclosed report. A subsequent telephone discussion was held with you and your staff to discuss the results of the inspection after the receipt of additional information submitted by you.

Areas examined during the inspection are identified in the report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observation of activities in progress.

Based on the results of this inspection, the NRC has determined that two violations of NRC requirements occurred. These violations are cited in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice) and the circumstances surrounding them are described in detail in the subject inspection report. The first violation is of concern because an operator error caused an emergency diesel generator to start in a condition other than it had been designed for.

The second violation is of concern because management failed to recognize the potential of this event occurring at power operation and, thus, did not perform timely corrective action from a previous event.

A third concern, although not a violation, was your failure to recognize that the emergency diesel test procedure normally used, when properly performed, precluded determining whether the prior test had left the diesel in the required condition, ready to start at idle speed as designed.

After you have had the opportunity to review this report and the concerns above, we request that you contact me or John Pellet at (817) 860-8183 to schedule a management meeting to discuss this event. Further, you are required to respond to this letter and should follow the instructions

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specified in the enclosed Notice when preparing your response. In your response, you should document the specific actions taken and any additional actions you plan to prevent recurrence. Your response may reference or include previous docketed correspondence, if the correspondence adequately addresses the required response. After reviewing your response to this Notice, including your proposed corrective actions and the results of future inspections, the NRC will determine whether further NRC enforcement action is necessary to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.790 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter, its enclosure(s), and your response will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room. To the extent possible, your response should not include any personal privacy, proprietary, or safeguards information so that it can be placed in the Public Document Room without redaction.

The responses directed by this letter and the enclosed Notice are not subject to the clearance procedures of the Office of Management and Budget as required by the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980, Pub. L. No. 96.511.
