Since the plant is being dismantled, Mr. Timpson thinks the United States should give the plant to the energy officials in the Commonwealth of Independent States. He believed the plant is very safe and argues it would be a waste not to put it to use. He says the reason it has been abandoned is due to the fact that evacuation is not feasible on Long Island. He points out that this would not apply to Chernobyl.
