Telephone Conversation With Layor Farl W. Willis of St. Wartinville, Louisiana (chone, (SIR) 392-5551)

Staff has received allocations of anticompetitive behavior on the part of Calf States Utilities (GSU) pursuant to its dealings with the City of St. Cartinville, La. Specifically, the City of Lafavette has asserted that St. Cartinville has had difficulty obtaining wheeling rights over CSU transmission lines as a means of receiving power from a supplier other than CSU. These allegations conflicted with recent statements made by CSU personnel and I telephoned Mayor Willis to try and ascertain the current status of the CSU/St. Cartinville relationship regarding third party cheeling.

ly initial remark to layor Willis indicated that we had received correspondence indicating that St. "artinville has not been able to successfully negotiate a wheeling contract with GSU. Navor Willis stated that this is not true and proceeded to elaborate on the recent negotiations with CSU. According to Willis, St. Partinville (City) had a wholesale contract with CSU that allowed the City the right to cancel annually with 60 or 90 days (he wasn't sure) notice. When the City's contract came up for renewal in the Spring of 1984, the City made the determination that it would be more cost efficient to take power from the City of Lafayette rather than GSU. When the City notified GSU of its intent to cancel the wholesale power contract, GSU indicated that the City could not take nower over GSU lines at less than 69ky, (presumably under its existing wholesale contract.) After considerable negotiations, the City decided to build its own substation, thereby enabling CSU to supply the City at 69ky. The City has extended its wholesale power contract with GS! through the Spring of 1985 (3/14/85) or until the City coupletes construction of its substation if later than that date. According to Uillis, once the substation is completed, the City will no longer be isolated (electrically) and will be free to shop or seek power from suppliers other than CSU. In closing, Payor Millis stated that the City of St. "artinville was "very satisfied" with the service provided by GSU.

[Apparently the City will be taking power from GSU under a recently negotiated Power Delivery Agreement (PDA) that provides transmission service to non-cenerating nower entities heretofore unavailable to non-generators. Then I asked "illis of the status of the GSU/City negotiations involving the PDA, he was unaware of the agreement even though he indicated that be, as "ayor, was the minciral negotiator with CSU in such matters]

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
