Enclosed is a copy of the final report for the August 22, 1991, exercise of the offsite radiological emergency response plans site-specific to the Diablo Canyon Power Plant. San Luis Obispo County and the Pacific Gas and Electric Company participated fully in the exercise. The State of California, and Santa Barbara County, participated on a limited basis in the exercise. The exercise report, dated January 15, 1992, was prepared by Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Region IX staff.

No Deficiencies were observed during the exercise. However, seven Areas Requiring Corrective Action (ARCA) were identified during the August 22, 1991, exercise. FEMA Region IX staff have reviewed the required corrective actions with officials of the State of California and San Luis Obispo County and the State has provided Region IX a schedule for completing all corrective actions. FEMA's Region IX staff will continue to monitor the status of corrective actions on these ARCA's.

Based on the results of the August 22, 1991, exercise, the offsite radiological emergency preparedness is adequate to provide reasonable assurance that appropriate measures can be taken offsite to protect the health and safety of the public in the event of a radiological emergency at the Diablo Canyon Power Plant.
