STATUS OF EVENDALE

After discussing the funding situation with RBT it was concluded that we should advise CR to give notice to GE to terminate their employees in order that RBT funds, which are only available this year, could be used to pay separation pay.

I discussed this with Mr. McCauley and Mr. Sapirio, OR. I suggested that CR terminate the GE contract as of May 31, and separate the people. I requested CR to draft a letter to the Air Force terminating the use permit (this letter will be discussed with the Commission).

I advised Mr. Jorns, of the Air Force, of this plan and he had no objection and said that the Air Force would excess the facility.

I advised Lyall E. Johnson, Assistant Director, Division of Materials Licensing, to hold the GE request for a license since the draft letter from CR would suggest that the Air Force obtain a license during the period the facility is being excessed and the GE information might be useful.

I advised Eugene E. Swindle and Bob Pearson that CR plans to circulate all the equipment and suggested to CR that it include in its draft letter to the Air Force a statement that any equipment not disposed of would be left in facility since the Air Force would be excessing it anyway.
