Dear Ms. Taylor:

Your letter to Mr. Dircks of June 26, 1984 has been referred to me. Upon review, it appears that several of the issues you raise were addressed in Mr. Dircks' letter of May 10, 1984 in response to your previous letter dated March 6, 1984. Although we are not responding to your comments regarding the individuals mentioned in your letter, there are two areas where I can provide additional information.

You asked for an example of where the NRC fined a utility for exceeding allowable radioactive release limits. We have identified one such case. Duke Power Company was issued a \$3,000 civil penalty on March 30, 1977 for releasing radioactivity to the Keowee River. The radioactive release exceeded 10 CFR Part 20 values. This civil penalty was imposed by NRC Order on June 13, 1977.

You also asked what regulations address control of radioactive effluent releases from nuclear power plants. I refer you to 10 CFR §50.34a "Design objectives for equipment to control releases of radioactive material in effluents - nuclear power reactors", and 10 CFR Part 50, Appendix I "Numerical Guides For Design Objectives and Limiting Conditions For Operation To Meet The Criterion 'As Low As Is Reasonably Achievable' For Radioactive Material In Light-Water-Cooled Nuclear Power Reactor Effluents". The regulations, which as you noted, establish design objectives, provide operational flexibility under unusual operating conditions, compatible with consideration of public health and safety, which may temporarily result in releases higher than the guidelines, but still within levels that assure that the average population exposure is equivalent to small fractions of doses from natural background radiation.

I trust this letter adequately addresses your additional concerns.
