SUBJECT: ALLEGED DISCRIMINATION IN VIOLATION OF 10 CFR 50.7

On February 18, 1992, the (I.S. Department of Labor's Wage and Hour Division in Kansas City, Missouri, received a complaint from an employee of the Wolf Creek Nuclear Operating Corporation (WCNOC). The employee alleged that he had been subjected to discriminatory treatment, including the receipt of a poor performance appraisal, because he had raised safety concerns while performing his duties at the Wolf Creek Nuclear Generating Station and because he filed allegations with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). Mr. Otto Maynard of your organization was informed of this complaint in a letter from the Department of Labor dated February 19, 1992.

On March 12, 1992, based on a settlement agreement having been reached between the complainant and WCNOC, the Department of Labor informed WCNOC and NRC that DOL had ceased its investigation of the allegation. A copy of the settlement agreement was provided to NRC.

While NRC recognizes that WCNOC has settled this matter with this individual, NRC must review this matter to determine whether a violation of 10 CFR 50.7 may have occurred. Such a violation, if it occurred, could have a chilling effect on other licensee or contractor personnel in that it might deter them from identifying any nuclear safety related concerns they may have.

Therefore, you are requested to provide this office, within 30 days of the date of this letter, a response which:

- Provides the basis for the employment action regarding the employee and includes a copy of any investigation reports you have regarding the circumstances of the action; and
- Describes the actions, if any taken or planned to assure that this
 employment action does not have a chilling effect in discouraging other
 licensee or contractor employees from raising perceived safety concerns.

Wolf Creek Nuclear Operating Corporation -2-After reviewing your response, the NRC will determine whether enforcement action is necessary at this time to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements. Please indicate in your response whether any of the information that you provide should be withheld from public disclosure based on the provisions of 10 CFR 2.790(a). Please cite the specific provision of this regulation that is applicable or other basis for nondisclosure. In accordance with 10 CFR 2.790 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter and its enclosure will be placed in the NRC Public Document Room. The responses directed by this letter are not subject to the clearance procedures of the Office of Management and Budget as required by the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980, Pub. L. No. 96-511.
