Safeguards Contingency Plan, Revision 1A

Enclosed are four copies of Revision 1A to the South Texas Project Safeguards Contingency Plan. In addition, three copies of this revision are being forwarded to Nuclear Regulatory Commission Region IV. This document supersedes all previous revisions. None of the changes described in this revision represent any lessening of security effectiveness; hence, this revision is being submitted in accordance with 10CFR50.54(p)(2).

The Safeguards Contingency Plan has been revised to serve as a better guide to contingency response actions and personnel responsibilities. Changes to the plan include the deletion of redundancies and unnecessary verbiage reformatting of the Responsibility Matrix for ease in reference, and the changing of some event titles for clarification. By referencing and not repeating information contained in The South Texas Project Physical Security Plan, Revision 1A of the Safeguards Contingency Plan has been made a non-Safeguards Information document. Specific changes to the Safeguards Contingency Plan are identified in Attachment One, "List of Changes". A comparison and brief explanation of event title changes is provided in Attachment Two: "Event Title Changes".


