TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION CHANGE REQUEST NO. 87
POINT BEACH NUCLEAR PLANT, UNITS 1 AND 2

On March 14, 1983, Wisconsin Electric Power Company applied for License Amendments and Technical Specification Changes to permit use of the Westinghouse Optimized Fuel Assembly design (OFA) at our Point Beach Nuclear Plant Units 1 and 2. Additional information and other editorial Technical Specification Changes were contained in a subsequent letter dated September 6, 1983. In another letter dated July 13, 1984, we provided the results of the OFA small-break LOCA analysis and submitted other licensing changes related to the use of OFA fuel.

In a letter dated August 1, 1984, the NRC staff requested additional information concerning the OFA fuel design. The purpose of this letter is to provide that additional information. Enclosed with this letter are the following items:

As discussed in our previous correspondence, we are planning to insert the initial region of OFA fuel into Point Beach Unit 2 during the fall 1984 refueling outage. This outage is presently scheduled for five weeks beginning on September 28, 1984.
