SUBJECT: CALLAWAY/WOLF CREEK FIRE PROTECTION CONCERN BOARD NOTIFICATION 84-145

In accordance with NPC procedures for Board Notifications, the following information is being provided directly to the Commission. The appropriate Boards and parties are being informed by copy of this memorandum. This information is applicable to Callaway and Wolf Creek which are presently ... before the Commission.

During a fire protection inspection at the Wolf Creek Generating Station it was discovered that for a fire in the control room, transfer switches for certain hot shutdown systems/components had to be switched to the alternate position prior to fire damage to circuits in the control room. If damage occurs prior to repositioning the transfer switches, preliminary results of the inspection indicate that following isolation of alternate hot shutdown systems/components some repairs may be required to reposition valves or start motors. At Wolf Creek, the procedures to transfer control require at least four minutes to perform, thereby requiring that no damage to circuits in the control room occur within the first four minutes after it is decided to isolate the systems from the control room.

Based on the preliminary results of the inspection at Wolf Creek, the staff has determined that its safety evaluation for the alternate shutdown capability at Wolf Creek is not correct. Our alternate shutdown evaluation concluded that hot standby could be achieved and maintained without the need for repairs, regardless of the assumed time it takes to sustain fire damage in the control room. Because both Callaway and Wolf Creek are SNUPPS units, the above concern is directly applicable to Callaway. The staff is continuing to study this matter to determine whether a problem exists at other plants and will notify any affected Boards and parties when the review is complete.
