SUBJECT: NRC INSPECTION REPORT NO. 50-458/92-08 (NOTICE OF VIOLATION)

This refers to the inspection conducted by Messrs. E. J. Ford and D. P. Loveless of this office on March 1 through April 11, 1992. The inspection included a review of activities authorized for your River Bend Station facility. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with you and those members of your staff identified in the enclosed report.

Areas examined during the inspection are identified in the report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examination of procedures and representative records, inspections of installed equipment and system lineups, interviews with personnel, and observations of activities in progress.

Based on the results of this inspection, certain of your activities appeared to be in violation of NRC requirements, as specified in the enclosed Notice of Violation (Notice). The violation is of concern because it indicates a lack of control over refueling preparations and that water coverage above activated fuel limits could be violated. Additionally, one unresolved item was identified involving your failure to maintain primary containment integrity during refueling operations. This event will be reviewed further to evaluate your initial corrective actions, as well as the safety significance of the event.

It is also our understanding that, during the exit interview conducted on April 16, 1992, Mr. L. A. England, Director, Nuclear Licensing, committed to modify or disposition all safe shutdown required motor-operated valves to correct the design limitations, identified in NRC Information Notice 92-18 . .volving the possibility of valve motor damage during a control room fire, prior to restart of the plant.

The decision to maintain the plant shutdown, as a result of damage caused by high winds, and to enter the refueling outage earlier than originally scheduled, was a conservative decision by management. This is an indication that management's approach to plant safety is a high priority at the River Bend Station.
