We encourage your continued assistance to the State of North Carolina and Brunswick and New Hanover counties to correct all deficiencies noted by FEMA before the next full scale exercise. At that time, all pertinent areas will be reevaluated, and the results used by the NRC in any decisions pertaining to the adequacy of the state of emergency preparedness at the Brunswick site.

We also encourage you to work closely with the state and counties in the development of a scenario for the next full scale exercise that will test as many of the areas as practical in which the previously identified deficiencies were found.
