Mrs. Graham -2-August 30, 1984 We recognize, Mrs. Graham, that telling you that your letter has been formally docketed and served on the parties to the Limerick proceeding probably does not go very far in reassuring you that your concerns are going to be resolved in the NRC licensing process before any decision is made about whether Limerick should be licensed. Congress has passed laws, however, both concluding that nuclear power plants may be operated safely and empowering the NRC to license plants which meet Federal requirements. All that I can promise you is that Limerick will only be licensed if the NRC finds that the plant and its emergency plans meet those Federal requirements. Very truly yours. Valarie M. Lane Valarie M.
