
PLANT HATCH - UNITS 1 AND 2
FITNESS FOR DUTY PROGRAM
10 CFR 26 COMPLIANCE REVISION

Gentlemen:

On December 28, 1989, Georgia Power Company submitted a certification to the NRC that the fitness-for-duty program had been implemented which meets the requirements of 10 CFR Part 26. In addition to this certification, Georgia Power Company informed the NRC that two additional substances not required by the rule were included in the panel of drugs for screening: benzodiazepines and barbiturates. The purpose of this letter is to inform the NRC that, effective June 1, 1992, Georgia Power Company will no longer screen for the additional substances of benzodiazepines and barbiturates. Compliance with 10 CFR Part 26 is not affected as a result of this change.
