SUMMARY

Scope:

This routine, announced inspection was conducted in various aspects of the Physical Security Program for Power Reactors. Specifically, the inspector reviewed audits, corrective actions, and management support; alarm stations and communications; and protected area detection. The inspector also reviewed the licensee's corrective action in response to LER 250/95-001-00.

Results:

Within the scope of the inspection, one Unresolved Item (URI 95-21-01, paragraph 2.2) in the area of fitness for duty was opened. In addition, one Non-Cited Violation (NCV 95-21-02, paragraph 3.0) in the area of control of Safeguards Information was noted. The licensee continues to have a strong audit program which was evidenced by favorable audits for 1994 and 1995. Also, Security's self-assessment program is considered a strength. Corrective actions and management support are timely and address problems appropriately. Alarm stations and communications provide necessary capabilities to meet 10 CFR 73.55. In the area of protected area detection, the licensee provided excellent equipment which exceeded regulatory requirements.

Arrangements were made with the licensee prior to the inspection for a member of the Armenian Nuclear Regulatory Authority and a member of the Atomic Energy Agency of the Republic of Kazakstan to accompany the NRC inspector. Under the Cooperative Threat Reduction Program, physical protection assistance is provided by various branches of the NRC that includes, but is not limited to, observation of the NRC inspection process.

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
