MOTION TO TERMINATE APPELLATE JURISDICTION

The Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) requests that the Atomic Safety and Licensing Appeal Board terminate its limited appellate jurisdiction over Yellow Creek Nuclear Plant, Units 1 and 2, which jurisdiction was retained over a single generic issue: the environmental effects associated with the release of radioactive radon gas to the atmosphere from the mining and milling of uranium for reactor fuel. A similar motion by TVA for Hartsville Nuclear Plant, Units 1B and 2B, was granted in ALAB-760 (copy attached).

The TVA Board of Directors decided on August 29, 1984 to cancel the Yellow Creek Nuclear Plant. Therefore, TVA moves that the Appeal Board dismiss as moot, without prejudice, these appellate proceedings.

MEMORANDUM AND ORDER

The Tennessee Valley Authority has advised us of the cancellation of Units 13 and 13 of its proposed four-unit Hartsville nuclear plant. On its motion, we therefore terminate, with respect to those two units, the limited appellate jurisdiction previously retained over this construction permit proceeding involving all four units. See Tennessee Valley Authority (Phipps Bend Nuclear Plant, Units 1 and 2), ALAB-752, 18 NRC ___ (December 5, 1983),

Jee ALAB-554, 10 MRC 13, 16 n.2, and ALAB-553, 10 MRC 153, 159 (1979). The retained jurisdiction was with regard to a single generic usue as to which an ultimate Commission determination has not as yet been reached: the environmental effect: associated with the release of radicactive radon gus (radon-122) to the atmosphere as a result of the mining and milling of uranium for reactor fuel.
