SUMMARY

I contacted Mr. Spearling as he was listed as a licensee contact in the response to NRC's Information Notice 89-25 (REV. 1) regarding the change of ownership. Mr. Spearling confirmed that there has been no change in the licensee's name (Timken Mercy Medical Center) since the change of ownership occurring October 31, 1995. Further, he stated that he has no plans to change the name near term but possibly in the future.

I also talked to Bob Gattuso who is an inspector there since the transfer. He said that although official notification <sup>of NRC</sup> was about 3 weeks after the fact, all looked to be in order and he and B.J. Holt decided a violation was not in order but in cover letter he would inform them that for any future change of ownership our notification and approval should be before actual transfer. Also discussed with John Rodgers and he concurred with sending letter to licensee acknowledging acceptance.

I am writing to provide your office with the necessary forms in connection with the change of ownership of Timken Mercy Medical Center, a general acute care hospital, located at 1320 Timken Mercy Drive, NW, Canton, Ohio 44708 (the "Hospital"). The Hospital was owned by Timken Mercy Medical Center, an Ohio not-for-profit corporation (the "Seller"). Effective November 1, 1995, ownership of the Hospital was transferred from the Seller to Columbia-CSA/HS Greater Canton Area Healthcare System, L.P., (the "Buyer"). The Buyer will continue to operate the Hospital as "Timken Mercy Medical Center".

The Buyer is an Ohio limited partnership, whose co-general partners are Columbia/HCA Healthcare Corporation of Northern Ohio, an affiliate of Columbia/HCA Healthcare Corporation, and CSA Health Network, the parent corporation of Seller.

In connection with this transaction, I enclose the following:

1. Response to Nuclear Regulatory Commission Information Notice 89-25, Rev.1;
2. Copy of the Bill of Sale as evidence of the completion of the transaction.

Assuming the Response is complete, please begin the process of issuing a materials license to Columbia-CSA/HS Greater Canton Area Healthcare System, L.P. d/b/a Timken Mercy Medical Center, effective November 1, 1995.



Dear Doctor Spriggs:

This is a report on the status of the Nuclear Medicine Section of Radiology based on a six-month review conducted during January 1995. Equipment includes a Trionix Triad gamma camera, Trionix Biad gamma camera, Siemens ZLC 370 gamma camera, Ohio Nuclear 420 camera, a Capintec CRC-10 dose calibrator, a Canberra well counter and thyroid probe, a Picker CDV-700 G-M survey meter, Ludlum Model 2 GM survey meter, Ludlum Model 14C GM survey meter, Ludlum Model 19A NaI survey meter, Keithley Digital Ionization survey meter, a flood phantom and a bar phantom (2.38, 3.18, 3.97, and 4.76 mm). All cameras are interfaced to a Trionix computer.

Radioisotopes are being provided by Syncor in individualized doses. No generator is in use at the present time. Isotopes in use include Tc-99m, Xe-133, Ga-67, In-111, Tl-201, I-131, and I-123.

Ronda Mottice, R.T.(N), C.N.M.T. is the Senior Technologist of the Nuclear Medicine Service and she was interviewed during the review.

The renewal application for the NRC license was approved with an expiration date of October 31, 1999. Amendment 44 is in effect. Dr. Bang is designated as the Radiation Safety Officer. A copy of all NRC correspondence regarding the license should be available in Nuclear Medicine. An inspection of the Nuclear Medicine service was conducted by the NRC in February 1992.

The State of Ohio registration of radioactive material expires May 31, 1996. The possession limits for the Ohio regulated materials are listed below:

Co-57	25 mCi
In-111	20 mCi
Ra-226	290 mCi
Ga-67	25 mCi
I-123	2.0 mCi
Tl-201	100 mCi

The last meetings of the Radiation Safety Committee were December 12, 1994 and September 19, 1994. The NRC requires quarterly meetings as stated in your license. An ALARA program was submitted to the NRC in the license application dated September 23, 1988.

Leak tests were performed on the Ba-133 and Cs-137 sealed sources used with the dose calibrator on July 20, 1994 and January 3, 1995. All tests were less than 0.005 micro-Curies. These semi-annual tests are next due in July 1995.

A CRC-10 dose calibrator is used to assay patient dose. An accuracy test was performed in January 1994. Linearity checks were performed in July 1994 and October 1994. A geometric variation test was performed on the dose calibrator in February 1993. Constancy checks are performed daily with Cs-137. The QC procedure monitors the constancy of readings of Cs-137 obtained on the following isotope stations: I-131, Ga-67, Xe-133, Tl-201, I-123, Tc-99m, and In-111.

The battery test for the dose calibrator indicates 150. The battery was replaced in August 1989.

Xenon is stored in the hot lab in a cabinet with negative air flow. Shielding consists of the manufacturer's lead-shield container.

The ventilation rates of the exhaust system for the remodelled department have been performed. All imaging rooms have negative pressure. Cleanace time is posted in Room 2 and 3. The NRC license requires the ventilation rates to be measured every six months.

A new trap was installed in February 1988 per my recommendation. NRC regulations require monthly checks of the Xenon trap. A trigger level of 50,000 CPM above background is established so that the supervisor will be informed of potential trap failure.

Persons with appropriate training and experience to administer radioisotopes IV have been reviewed, approved, and listed by name. The approval of named individuals is given by the Medical Staff. This list is posted. This is in accord with the Joint Commission on Hospital Accreditation Organization (JCAHO).

In accordance with the JCAHO requirements, inservice meetings should be encouraged in addition to the attendance of key personnel at outside meetings. An excellent means of continuing education is to send key personnel to Central Chapter and/or National Society of Nuclear Medicine meetings, then require the Technologist attending to present a summary at an inservice meeting. The physician's continued training in interpretations of new studies must be matched by continued training by the Technologists in performing the technical aspects of the study. Documentation of meetings and methods of transfer of information to other personnel is important.

Housekeeping was provided instruction with respect to cleaning the Nuclear Medicine area in December 1994.

The NRC Notice to Employees and license is posted as required. A statement is also posted stating that 10CFR20 and 10CFR19 are available from the Administrative Director's office. The State of Ohio Acknowledgement of Registration of Radiation Sources and Notice to Employees are posted. The NRC regulatory guide 8.13 pertaining to pregnant radiation workers is also posted.

Constancy check of the survey meter is performed each day of use with a small source. The calibration of survey meters is performed by:

The NRC requires the availability of a high exposure rate survey meter for I-131 treatments. A Keithley Model 36150 ionization survey meter has been obtained for the Nuclear Medicine Service. A 10 uCi Cs-137 disk source is available as a check source.

Flood studies are performed each day of use on each camera and are recorded by storing films. Bar studies are performed weekly. The Trionix Biad is capable of resolving 3.18 mm; the Ohio Nuclear 420 (high resolution collimator) is capable of resolving 2.38 mm, and Siemens ZLC 370 (LEAP collimator) is capable of resolving 3.18 mm.

All incoming packages are monitored at three feet and at the surface. The packages are also checked for contamination using smear surveys. The receipt of these packages and these checks are recorded.

Surveys are required on a weekly basis. The area survey includes all imaging rooms, hot lab, stress lab, and waste storage area. Trigger levels have been set for each of these areas.

Quarterly inventory of sealed sources was conducted in October 1994 and July 1994.

All rooms where radioactive materials are stored are locked at night when the Section is unattended. Radioisotope handling procedures are posted in the hot lab. Written procedures are posted for major and minor spills.

The patient dose log shows confirmation of the dose administered to the patient. Dr. Bang's name appears on the Syncor dose record.

The decay-in-storage method of disposal is currently practiced. This waste is kept in the hot lab or waste storage area and then monitored before disposal. Also, used syringes are returned to Syncor for disposal.

There have been no reported eventful exposures to Nuclear Medicine personnel in the film badge reports through November 1994. Exposure for the Nuclear Medicine personnel are consistent with other individuals performing similar work. All reports for Nuclear Medicine personnel are on a separate account (Series C). The whole body quarterly exposure for each individual working in Nuclear Medicine is well below the permissible 1250 mrem. Exposures for individuals working in Nuclear Medicine are as follows:

J. Fergason	350 mrem
R. Mottice	150 mrem
C. Lucas	410 mrem
C. Gazda	210 mrem
K. Talbert	110 mrem

Cold trash from the hot lab is monitored before it is removed from the hot lab. If the trash reads background, then it is placed outside the hot lab for removal by Housekeeping personnel. The hot lab is cleaned by a Nuclear Medicine Technologist.

The Canberra thyroid uptake probe and well counter were calibrated on June 26, 1989; June 7, 1990; January 3, 1991; January 7, 1992; January 13, 1993; June 7, 1993; July 20, 1994; and January 3, 1995. A 1.07 uCi Cs-137 has been purchased for quality control checks on this counting system. The quality control results for the well/uptake probe were reviewed. The energy resolution for the uptake probe and well counter is 8% and 7%, respectively. Gain setting for the well and uptake probe is 46.46 and 8.0, respectively.

Ranges of radiopharmaceutical activity for various studies is posted in the hot lab. Rules for safe use of radiopharmaceuticals are posted in the hot lab.

Technologists are required to monitor their hands before leaving this area. No written record of the monitoring results is necessary.


The Radiation Safety Officer must review and sign the accuracy and linearity checks for the dose calibrator as well as the leak tests and quarterly sealed source inventories. The RSO must also review the area surveys on a monthly basis.

The following observations and recommendations are presented as a result of this review:

1. A review of the QMP was conducted on July 20, 1994. Twenty treatment records were reviewed. No recordable events or misadministrations were identified.
2. QMP training should be provided to all nuclear medicine technologists.
3. Each nuclear medicine technologist should be provided a written statement of his/her personnel monitoring readings for calendar year 1994. A form indicating the required information was provided to Ms. Mottice.

LEAK TESTS

On January 3, 1995, leak tests were conducted on the calibration and reference sources used in Nuclear Medicine. A Q-tip was used to wipe each source and then counted. Each wipe sample was counted for three (3) minutes. The window setting was 50-1000 keV.


The counting efficiency for a Cs-137 reference source (1.07 uCi on November 28, 1988) has been determined to be 29%. The observed count rate is 602,000 CPM. The background count rate is 149 CPM.

RESPONSE TO NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION  
INFORMATION NOTICE 89-25, REV.1

The Applicant, Columbia-CSA/HS Greater Canton Area Healthcare System, L.P., an Ohio limited partnership, (the "Transferee") provides the following information to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission ("NRC"), concerning the change of ownership of Timken Mercy Medical Center:

1. At this time, there will be no change in the name of the licensed organization, Timken Mercy Medical Center (the "Hospital").
2. The new licensee contact and telephone number(s) to facilitate communications is: Radiation Safety Officer Dan Bang, M.D. or his designate Stephen L. Spearing, R.T.(R), Administrative Director of Radiology Services. The telephone number is (216) 489-1067.
3. As currently proposed, the assets of the Hospital will be contributed to the Transferee, whose general partners are Columbia/HCA Healthcare Corporation of Northern Ohio, an Ohio corporation ("Columbia-Ohio") and CSA Health Network, an Ohio not-for-profit corporation. A list of the officers and directors of each general partner is attached hereto as Exhibit A and B, respectively. The day-to-day operations of the Hospital will be managed by Columbia-Ohio.  
  
There will be no changes in Hospital staff, radiation safety officer, authorized users, or any other person identified in the current license.
4. The transferor, Timken Mercy Medical Center, an Ohio not-for-profit corporation, (the "Transferor") will not remain in non-licensed business without the license.
5. As set forth above, the Transferor will contribute the assets of the Hospital to the Transferee, a limited partnership, in which CSA Health Network, the corporate parent of Transferor, and Columbia-Ohio will each have a 50% interest.
6. There are no planned changes in organization, location, facility, equipment or procedures, except as set forth above.
7. There will be no changes in the use, possession, location or storage of the licensed materials.

8. There will be no change in organization, location, facilities, equipment, procedures, or personnel that would require a license amendment even without the change of ownership, except as noted above.
9. All surveillance items and records will be current at the time of transfer. A description of the status of all surveillance requirements and records is attached as Exhibit C.
10. All records concerning the safe and effective decommissioning of the facility, pursuant to 10 CFR 30.35(g), 40.36(f), 70.25(g) and 72.30(d); public dose; and waste disposal by release to sewers, incineration, radioactive material spills, and on-site burials, will be transferred to the new licensee at the time of the closing of the transaction, currently anticipated to occur on or about October 31, 1995.
11. There is no contamination of facilities and/or equipment.
12. There is no contamination of facilities and/or equipment.
13. Transferee agrees to abide by all commitments and representations previously made to NRC by the Transferor.  
  
There is no contamination of facilities and/or equipment.  
  
There are no open inspection items.
14. The agreement of the Transferee and Transferor to the change in ownership of the license material and activity, and the conditions of transfer is evidenced by the execution of this Response by both Transferor and Transferee. A copy of the Bill of Sale will be forwarded to the NRC upon closing as evidence of the transaction.  
  
As set forth above there are no open inspection items.
15. Transferee will abide by all constraints, conditions, requirements, representations and commitments identified in the existing license.

## BILL OF SALE AND ASSIGNMENT

This BILL OF SALE AND ASSIGNMENT ("Bill of Sale and Assignment") is made, executed and delivered as of October 31, 1995 by THE SISTERS OF CHARITY OF ST. AUGUSTINE HEALTH SYSTEM, INC., an Ohio not-for-profit corporation ("CSA/HS") and TIMKEN MERCY MEDICAL CENTER, an Ohio not-for-profit corporation ("Timken") (CSA/HS and Timken are hereinafter collectively referred to as "Grantor") to COLUMBIA-CSA/HS GREATER CANTON AREA HEALTHCARE SYSTEM, L.P. ("Grantee").

### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Grantor and Grantee, among others, are parties to that certain Master Sale and Contribution Agreement dated September 5, 1995 (the "Agreement") providing for, among other things, the transfer and sale to Grantee of certain assets and properties, owned by Grantor and used in the operation of Timken Mercy Medical Center and certain other facilities operated in connection therewith, all as more fully described in the Agreement, in consideration of ownership interests in Grantee, as more particularly described in Schedule A hereto, and the assumption of certain liabilities, in the amount and manner and on the terms and conditions provided in the Agreement. Capitalized terms used and not otherwise defined herein shall have the meanings ascribed to such terms in the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties now desire to carry out the intent and purpose of the Agreement by Grantor's execution and delivery to Grantee of this instrument evidencing the vesting in Grantee of the CSA/HS Canton Assets, in addition to such other instruments as Grantee shall have otherwise received or may hereafter request.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of other valuable consideration to Grantor in hand paid by Grantee, at or before the execution and delivery hereof, the receipt and sufficiency of which by Grantor is hereby acknowledged, Grantor has conveyed, granted, bargained, sold, transferred, assigned, aliened, remised, released, delivered and confirmed, and by this Bill of Sale and Assignment does hereby convey, grant, bargain, sell, transfer, set over, assign, alien, remise, release, deliver and confirm unto Grantee, its successors and assigns forever, all of its right, title and interest in and to the CSA/HS Canton Assets, held by Grantor as the same shall exist on the date hereof, but excluding the CSA/HS Excluded Assets. The CSA/HS Canton Assets so granted, bargained, sold, assigned, aliened, remised, released, conveyed, transferred, set over and confirmed hereby, being, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, more particularly described on Schedule B hereto.



This Bill of Sale and Assignment and the covenants and agreements herein contained shall be binding upon Grantor, its successors and assigns, and shall inure to the benefit of Grantee, its successors and assigns.

The right to have transferred to Grantee all amounts (to the extent included as a current asset of the CSA/HS Canton Entities relating to the CSA/HS Canton Facilities in CSA/HS Adjusted Working Capital) which as of the Closing Date are or may become due and payable to the respective CSA/HS Canton Entities under either the Medicare or Medicaid or any third party payor program for patient receivables for unprocessed and unpaid claims relating to periods prior to Closing (other than those related to CSA/HS Excluded Liabilities or CSA/HS Excluded Assets) (but excluding any other reimbursements from Medicare, Medicaid, Blue Cross and other third-party payor programs relating to periods on or prior to Closing or the sale under the Agreement).
