Dear Mr. Parr:

In Reference 1 we requested that the Staff temporarily defer consideration of the Supply System's financial qualifications to construct WPPSS Nuclear Project No. 4 (WNP-4). The basis for this request was that execution of the Participants' Agreements for WNP-4 had been delayed pending completion of secondary environmental impact statements pursuant to the Washington State Environmental Policy Act.

This letter is to inform the NRC Regulatory Staff that Participants' Agreements have been fully executed for 100% of the output of WNP-4 and for the Supply System's share (90%) of the output of WPPSS Nuclear Project No. 5 (WNP-5). As mentioned in Reference 2, WNP-4 and the Supply System's share of WNP-5 will be financed as one system. The participants in WNP-4 and WNP-5 are approximately 89 public and cooperative utilities (consisting of 21 municipalities, 24 public utility districts and 44 electric cooperatives) located principally in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, and Montana.

As you may be aware, by letter dated July 9, 1976, we requested that the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board take steps to receive additional evidence from the Applicant and the Staff by the end of July, 1976, with

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a view toward supplementing its Initial Decision with appropriate findings relating to the Applicant's financial qualifications to construct WNP-4. We are hopeful that a favorable supplemental Initial Decision will be issued promptly thereafter, leading to the issuance of a construction permit for WNP-4 in the first or second full week of September, 1976.

The method of financing MNP-4 and the Supply System's share of MNP-5 was presented to the Staff in Reference 2 in response to Staff Questions 1.(a) and 1.(b). In addition, the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board explored this method of financing at some length at the radiological health and safety hearings held in November, 1975 (Tr. 820-845, 850-852).

An updated estimate of the total cost of WNP-4 (current as of May 31, 1976) is:

Siting, fuel cycle costs, payments to vendors and preliminary construction expenditures through May 31, 1976, for WNP-4 and WNP-5 are \$21,074,00 and \$7,896,000, respectively. Current estimates for WNP-4 and WNP-5 future expenditures (including fuel and owners' cost) are as follows:

With the execution of Participants' Agreements, financing of WNP-4 and WNP-5 will be continued by the issuance of approximately \$2,718,000,000 of tax exempt revenue bonds in series from time to time during the period of construction. The Supply System plans to issue these bonds in the following approximate amounts and on the following schedules:

Each series of bonds issued will be on a parity with other bonds issued. A scheduled summarizing financing activities through June 15, 1976, for all WPPSS construction projects is attached hereto.
